AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ANY CONTRACTS FOR THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION'S STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT AND/OR LOCAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS AS REQUIRED, FOR PROGRAM YEAR 2026 (PY 40) FOR THE SECOND PHASE OF THE 4TH STREET REPAVING PROJECT.

Scope/Description: The OPWC's Issue II process now operates on a one-year cycle. Projects submitted this year are being considered for funding next year. An application is due for any projects requesting funding in Program Year 2026 (PY 40).

City staff recommend submitting the Second Phase of the 4th Street Repaving Project for funding.

4th Street would be milled and resurfaced from Millard Drive to Sharts Road. Thermoplastic centerline and edge lines would be included in the project where needed. Deteriorated curb and gutter will also be replaced as needed.

Budget Impact: The 4th Street Repaving Phase II Project would cost an estimated total of \$730,000, which would be paid as follows:

- 51% in local share/City funds (\$373,000)
- 49% in OPWC funds (\$357,000)

WHEREAS, the State Capital Improvement Program and the Local Transportation Improvement Program both provide financial assistance to political subdivisions for capital improvements to public infrastructure;

WHEREAS, the City of Franklin is planning to make capital improvements by completing the Second Phase of the 4th Street Repaving Project; and

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvement project herein above described are considered to be a priority need for the community and is a qualified project under the OPWC programs,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Franklin, Ohio, a majority of members present concurring, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into any agreement with OPWC for funds for capital improvements and/or local transportation improvements for the Program Year 2026 (PY 40) for the Second Phase of the 4th Street Repaving Project.

Section 2. The City Manager is further authorized to enter into any agreements as may be necessary and appropriate to obtain financial assistance for this Project.

Section 3. It is found that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code, and the Rules of Council.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage.
