AGENDA TEXT: BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS REAPPOINTMENT – A request to approve the reappointment of Andrea Stolarczyk to the Arts and Culture Board for another three-year term to expire in March of 2026

BACKGROUND

Arts & Culture Board member Andrea Stolarczyk's term expires in March of 2023, thus creating a vacancy. The vacancy has been advertised on the City's website at fruta.org and on Facebook beginning on January 26, 2023 through the present.

On February 9, 2023, Andrea Stolarczyk submitted her application for reappointment to the board. No additional applications were received by staff for the vacant seat.

Mayor Kincaid and Councilor Purser recommend Andrea Stolarczyk's reappointment to the Arts and Culture Board for another three-year term to expire in March of 2026. If Ms. Stolarczyk is reappointed, there will be no remaining vacancies on the Arts and Culture Board.

Ms. Stolarczyk will be term limited to one more three-year term if she is reappointed on March 7, 2023 pursuant to the City's Boards and Commissions Policy that was adopted by the City Council on August 4, 2020.
