AGENDA TEXT: BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS APPOINTMENT – A request to approve the appointment of Bradley Reist to the Police Commission as a regular member to fulfill an unexpired term plus an additional three-year term to expire in May of 2027

BACKGROUND

On July 21, 2023, Police Commission member Troy Hayes resigned from the Police Commission, thus creating a vacancy. His term was due to expire in May of 2024. The vacancy has been advertised on the City's website at fruita.org and on the City's Facebook page since July 26, 2023 to the present.

On June 21, 2023, Bradley Reist submitted his application for the vacant seat on the Police Commission. Mayor and Council Liaison to the Police Commission Joel Kincaid recommend that he be appointed to the Police Commission to fulfill Troy Hayes' unexpired term plus an additional three-year term that will expire in May of 2027.

Mr. Reist's application is attached for the Council's review. If he is appointed, there will be no remaining vacancies on the Police Commission.
