<u>Overall Performance</u>: Collectively, sales and use tax revenues have remained higher compared to the budget through November by \$154,943 and have outpaced the prior year to date by \$129,166.

<u>Sales Tax Revenue Increase</u>: The increase in sales tax revenue is largely driven by city and county sales tax revenues, which increased \$73,082 year-to-date compared to the prior year. Sales tax associated with Rental and Leasing, and Manufacturing accounted for 65% of sales tax revenue year-to-date.

<u>Use Tax on Building Materials Down:</u> Use taxes on building materials is experiencing significant decline from the prior year down \$70,652, or 22% from the prior year to date and down \$105,978 compared to the budgeted amount for 2024.

<u>Lodging Tax Decrease</u>: Lodging tax revenues were down 22% or \$2,757 below the same month last year. Overall lodging tax is 6% higher from the prior year.

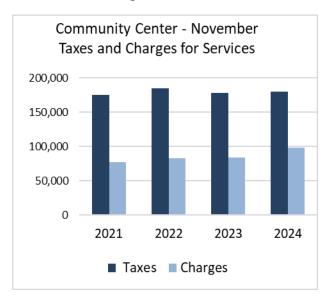
City Sales Tax by NAICS category:

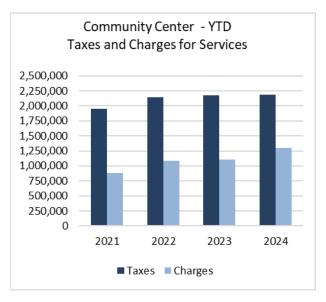
The following table shows a monthly comparison between November 2023 and 2024 city sales tax collections by NAICS category. Most categories have seen declines from the prior year. The largest reduction in percentage was Oil and Gas, down 50%, the largest dollar reduction was retail trade, down \$9,077 from the prior year. Remote sales were up 6% over the prior year.

<u>Community Center Fund Charges for Services and Tax Revenues – November 2024</u>

November charges for services (pass fees and recreation programs) and sales and use tax revenue were higher from the prior year. The year-to-date comparison from the prior year reveals a 17% increase in revenue from charges for service and 0.5% overall increase.
