**AGENDA TEXT:** BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS APPOINTMENT – A request to approve

the reappointment of John Rodwick to the Livability Commission for another

three-year term to expire in June of 2025

### **BACKGROUND**

The membership guidelines of the Livability Commission call for a minimum of seven and a maximum of twenty-one members. There are currently nine members on the board, so there is the potential for twelve (12) vacancies on the board. Staff has advertised these vacancies on the City's website and Facebook page for over a year and a half and will continue to do so, but has not received any applications other than one from Al Conder, who was appointed to the board in April of 2022.

John Rodwick's term on the Livability Commission expired in November of 2021 and Mr. Rodwick has expressed interest in remaining on the board. Mayor Kincaid and Council Liaison to the board Jeannine Purser recommend his reappointment for another three-year term to expire in June of 2025.

If John Rodwick is reappointed, there is still the potential for eleven (11) remaining vacancies on the board. Additionally, pursuant to the Boards and Commissions Policy adopted by the City Council on August 4, 2020, if John Rodwick is reappointed, he will be limited to one more consecutive term after being reappointed.
