Reed Park

The Fruita Chamber of Commerce is requesting to be able to serve beer/wine/alcohol at Reed Park during the Fruita Fall Festival Cornhole Tournament taking place Saturday September 25, 2021, 11:00 am – 6:00 pm

- 1. <u>Description</u>: The Fruita Fall Festival is an annual event that takes place in Downtown Fruita. The cornhole tournament will take place at Reed Park, to allow for plenty of space to spread attendees and participants apart.
- 2. <u>Security</u>: Board members, employees and volunteers along with whoever the Fruita Chamber hires to work the event will monitor the entrances to the licensed area to make sure no alcohol enters or exits the licensed area. Signs will be posted indicating no alcohol into or out of the licensed area.
- 3. <u>Crowd Control</u>: Board members, employees and volunteers along with whoever the Fruita Chamber hires to work the event will monitor the consumption of alcohol to prevent any patrons from becoming noticeably intoxicated and stop serving any patron showing effects of intoxication. Fruita Police Dept. will be notified if any activity escalates beyond control of said people.
- 4. <u>Fencing/Barriers</u>: A rope will serve as a fence barricade around the perimeter of the beer garden and cornhole tournament. Only 1 entrance point will be open and staff/volunteers will manage this barrier.
- 5. <u>Toilets</u>: Restroom facilities are available at Reed Park.
- 6. <u>Signage</u>: Signs will be posted at the entrance/exit indicating no alcohol beyond this point and that ID's will be checked.
- 7. <u>ID's</u>: ID's will be checked by Board members, employees and volunteers along with whoever the Fruita Chamber hires to serve alcohol and those imbibing will be issued a wristband indicating an ID has been checked for legal consumption age.
- 8. <u>Training</u>: Whoever the Fruita Chamber hires to work the event (bartenders, servers) will be trained in the procedures concerning the sale and service of alcoholic beverages.
- 9. <u>Trash</u>: Board members, employees, volunteers and whoever the Fruita Chamber hires to work the event will monitor the area and pick up empty beverage containers to keep premises clean and neat.
- 10. <u>Food</u>: A food truck will be invited to attend the event. If they are not able to attend, pretzels and various snacks will also be provided.

Health and Safety Plan

Event Overview: Fruita Fall Festival is a 2-day outdoor festival that takes place in Downtown Fruita. The hours are Friday 3:00 pm – 10:00 pm and Saturday 8:00 am – 10:00 pm. Entertainment will include live music, games, beer garden, various sub-events including a cornhole tournament, outhouse races, and a baking and canning contest, food and vendor booths. In previous years, the event has been a 3-days festival and has seen close to 50k attendees. We anticipate at least 30k attendees over the weekend for the 106th Annual Celebration. Friday night will include a Brew Fest in the beer garden with a variety of local breweries to help serve beverages in the beer garden.

Festival Guidelines:

- Transparency Statement will be included on home page of fruitafallfestival.com
- Social distancing and handwashing signs will be displayed throughout the venue and next to restrooms and food vendors with high traffic.
- Restrooms and handwashing stations will be spread out throughout the venue to allow for plenty of opportunities to wash hands and less lines formed.
- Attendees will be encouraged to bring their own chairs to enjoy the concert. We will also
 encourage attendees to visit local businesses and the outdoor seating area during the event if
 they would like to sit down to enjoy their food. Some chairs and tables will be available in the
 food court area (Civic Center parking lot) and inside of the Wine and Whiskey area on Mulberry
 Street. Wipes will be provided for attendees to wipe down their own tables and staff/volunteers
 will monitor areas to be cleaned.
- Vendors will not be set up in the grass to allow for more room for attendees to spread out and enjoy the music. Event sponsors will be the only booths allowed to set up in the grass of civic center area and will be limited to encourage social distancing.
- Cones and signage will be set 12 feet from the stage to ensure the crowd is not too close to the musicians.
- All staff and volunteers will be required to continue to self-monitor for symptoms and will not attend the event if they feel unwell.
- Signage will be posted to encourage masks.
- All vendors will be spaced 3 feet apart. All games will be spaced 6 feet apart.
- The alcohol area at Civic Center will have 3 entrance and exit points, as shown on the map.
- The wine and whiskey area will have 1 entrance point, as shown on the map. It will be an outdoor area, with no tent and minimal seating. Staff and volunteers will monitor tables and chairs for cleaning and wipes will be available for attendees.

Brew Fest

- A notice will be sent to breweries on refill policies for Brew Fest attendees mugs. All Brew Fest attendees will receive commemorative mug that will allow for larger beer pours in the beer garden. Mugs are to not make contact with beer lines when refilling for attendees.
- Cones signage will be set up and roped off between the beer tents to help keep lines socially distanced from one another.
- Refund policy will allow for refunds if a ticket is purchased in advance and the attendee does not feel well.
- Booths will be spaced 3 feet apart

Games

- Local schools will offer "carnival style" games for fundraisers with their PTA groups. Social distancing signs will be posted in the game area.
- Handwash station will be included in game area.

Food

- In addition to the extra handwashing stations, we will ask vendors to also encourage social distancing while attendees are waiting in line and encourage food vendors to wear masks.
- Food trucks will be spaced out to ensure no clusters form in lines.

Parade

- Signage will be posted along street and sidewalk to encourage attendees to remain within their groups and to social distance between groups.
- The parade route will be posted for the general public to outline viewing locations to allow for all attendees to spread out through entire parade route.

Cornhole Tournament (9/25 at Reed Park)

- 2 public Bathrooms are located at Reed Park with handwash sinks
- Social distancing signs will be posted
- Attendees will be encouraged to wear masks
