



Special Event Liquor Permit Narrative

The Coco Vino Fundraiser scheduled for Friday, March 10, 2023 benefits the Fruita Arts and Culture board and their projects.

Wine will be served by adult volunteers and pours will come from a variety of wines provided by local wineries. This is not a wine tasting event.

There is one door for entry and exit into the building, "Our Lady of Perpetual Motion." An additional emergency exit is located at the rear of the building. Both the front and rear of the building doors will be monitored by a volunteer at each.

The licensed area is the main floor of Our Lady of Perpetual Motion. Wine will only be consumed on the main floor of this building.

There are two restrooms located on the main floor of Our Lady of Perpetual Motion.

Two volunteers will be tasked with monitoring the crowd and alcohol consumption. Participants will be restricted to two glasses (5 oz.) of wine during the event.

Signage will be posted at the Aspen Street and alley entrance/exit stating that no alcohol can be taken outside of the building.

ID's will be checked upon entry to the event. This is an adult only event.

All volunteers and board members will receive onsite training one hour prior to the event regarding proper protocols.

Food/desserts will be catered by local food vendors.


The undersigned owners of Sacred Heart Church in Fruita, d/b/a Our Lady of Perpetual Motion, located at 503 E Aspen in Fruita, Colorado, hereby consent to its use as an event venue on March 10, 2023 in consideration for FACB's valuable efforts to enhance the community of Fruita and to promote Our Lady of Perpetual Motion as an event venue.

Permission to access the venue by the Fruita Arts and Culture Board (FACB) is conditioned on the following:

- 1) FACB assumes all responsibility for organizing the event, including obtaining any necessary licenses, promotion of the event, communicating with attendees, and coordinating with any vendors for delivery/pickup of any rental equipment.
- 2) FACB will have access to the venue starting in the morning of March 10, 2023; if access prior to that date is desired, the owners will endeavor to accommodate FACB's needs to the extent possible. Prior notice is appreciated.
- 3) FACB will have full access to amenities available to other guests of the church, except for use of the bedrooms and downstairs shower room. This includes use of all bathrooms and bath linens, wifi, sound system/televisions, dishes, kitchen appliances and equipment, and dishes/glassware/silverware as needed. There shall be no overnight guests without owners' express permission.
- 4) FACB will make reasonable efforts to minimize disturbance from the event to neighbors of Our Lady of Perpetual Motion, including with respect to sound disturbance after 10pm.
- 5) FACB agrees to promptly inform owners of any damage or injury arising in connection with the event, and to cooperate to the extent necessary to remedy such damage or injury, including reasonable reimbursement for repairs or submitting information to insurance carriers if appropriate.
- 6) FACB will pay to reimburse owners' incurred costs involved with cleanup of the venue after the event, as charged by the managing agent for Our Lady of Perpetual Motion or another cleaning agency mutually agreed with the owners. No other compensation is expected from FACB.

CIRSA hereby certifies that the above-named entity is a participating member of CIRSA for property/casualty coverages for the coverage period of January 1, 2023 to January 1, 2024.

CIRSA liability coverages for the coverage period will be as described in a CIRSA liability policy and NLC Mutual and GEM Mutual reinsurance agreements which will provide the liability and errors and omissions coverages summarized below. CIRSA property and crime coverages for the coverage period will be as described in a CIRSA property policy and excess policies from the carriers identified on the attached Property Coverage Schematic.

The coverages, conditions of membership, and other provisions applicable to CIRSA property/casualty members are described in CIRSA's Bylaws and Intergovernmental Agreement, coverage and/or excess/reinsurance coverage policies, and general policies adopted by the members, as from time to time amended.

The types and monetary limits of the coverages to be provided to CIRSA property/casualty members for the coverage period shall be as described below. The scope, terms, conditions, and limitations of the coverages shall be governed by the applicable policies and/or excess/reinsurance policies, the CIRSA Bylaws and Intergovernmental Agreement, and other applicable documents.

I. TYPES OF COVERAGES (subject to the limit on CIRSA's liability as described in Section II below):

- A. Property coverage (including auto physical damage and first party cyber)
- B. Liability coverage:
 - 1. General liability
 - 2. Auto liability
 - 3. Law enforcement liability
 - 4. Public Officials errors and omissions liability
 - 5. Third party cyber liability
- C. Crime coverage (including employee dishonesty and money and securities)

II. CIRSA LOSS FUNDS, RETENTIONS, EXCESS INSURERS/REINSURERS, AGGREGATE LIMITS, AND MEMBER DEDUCTIBLES:

For the coverages described in Section I, CIRSA shall be liable only for payment of the applicable self-insured retentions and only to a total annual aggregate amount for CIRSA members as a whole of the amount of the applicable CIRSA loss fund for the coverage period. There shall be no aggregate excess coverage over any loss fund.

Coverages in excess of CIRSA's self-insured retentions shall be provided by the applicable excess insurers and/or reinsurers in applicable excess and reinsurance policies and shall be payable by those excess insurers and/or reinsurers.

The limits of coverage provided by the excess insurers and/or reinsurers for the coverage period shall be described in the coverage documents issued to the members. Sublimits, aggregate and other limits shall apply as provided in said documents.

CIRSA LOSS FUND AMOUNTS FOR THE COVERAGE PERIOD:

Loss fund amounts are as adopted or amended from time to time by the Board of Directors based on the members in the property/casualty pool for the year. Information on current loss fund amounts is available from the CIRSA Chief Financial Officer.

CIRSA SELF-INSURED RETENTIONS FOR THE COVERAGE PERIOD:

- A. \$1,000,000 each and every loss and/or occurrence property*
- B. \$100,000 each loss/annual aggregate first party cyber
- C. \$1,000,000 each and every claim and/or occurrence general liability
- D. \$1,000,000 each and every claim and/or occurrence auto liability
- E. \$1,000,000 each and every claim and/or occurrence law enforcement liability
- F. \$1,000,000 each and every claim and/or occurrence public officials liability
- G. \$ 500,000 each claim/annual aggregate third party cyber liability
- H. \$ 150,000 each and every loss and/or occurrence crime

*Subject further to CIRSA retention of first \$5,000,000 each and every hail/wind loss and/or occurrence

EXCESS INSURERS/REINSURERS FOR THE COVERAGE PERIOD:

- A. Property: Per Property Coverage Schematic attached
- B. Liability: NLC Mutual and GEM Mutual (reinsurance)
- C. Excess Crime: AIG

LIMITS/EXCESS LIMITS FOR THE COVERAGE PERIOD:

- A. Excess property: to \$500 million per claim/occurrence
- B. Excess liability: to \$10 million per claim/occurrence (except excess auto liability to \$5 million and Public Officials Errors and Omissions and class-action suits arising out of discrimination to \$10 million per claim/\$10 million annual aggregate per member)
- C. Excess Crime (optional): up to \$5 million per claim/occurrence

III. MEMBER DEDUCTIBLES:

The member shall be responsible for payment of the member-selected deductible on each claim/occurrence. The deductible amounts selected by the above named entity are: \$10,000 (Liability), \$10,000 (Auto Liability), \$5,000 (Auto Physical Damage), and \$5,000 (Property). Payment of the deductible shall reduce the amount otherwise payable under the applicable CIRSA retention. In the event of a loss or occurrence involving more than one CIRSA member, each member shall pay its full applicable deductible(s).

IV. POLICIES GOVERN PAYMENTS:

Payments within the member's deductible(s) and/or CIRSA's self-insured retention(s), or in excess of the member's deductible(s) and/or CIRSA's self-insured retention(s), in connection with any claims/occurrences shall be governed by the excess and/or reinsurance policies.
