AGENDA TEXT: BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS APPOINTMENT – A request to approve the appointment of Peggy Vertiz to the Historic Preservation Board for a three-year term to expire in September of 2025

BACKGROUND

In May of 2019, Historic Preservation Board member Sean McConville resigned from the board, thus creating a vacancy. On August 2, 2022 Peggy Vertiz submitted her application to be appointed to the Historic Preservation Board, which is attached.

Mayor Kincaid and Board Liaison Councilor Miller recommend her appointment to the Historic Preservation Board for a three-year term to expire in September of 2025.

If Peggy Vertiz is appointed, there will be no remaining vacancies on the Historic Preservation Board.
