<u>Overall Performance</u>: Sales and use tax revenues were slightly higher than at the same time one year ago and higher than budgeted. County sales tax continues to provide strong support.

<u>Sales Tax Revenue Increase</u>: The increase in sales tax revenue is driven by county sales tax revenues, which increased \$74,960 compared to the same time last year. The City Sales Tax was 7% lower, or \$36,982 less than the same time last year.

<u>Use Tax on Building Materials Increase:</u> Use tax on building materials is slightly higher than one year ago and exceeding the budgeted amount year to date.

<u>Lodging Tax Unchanged:</u> Lodging tax revenues are slightly higher than the prior month and year to date. January through March tends to be seasonally slower months in this area.


City Sales Tax by NAICS category:


The following table shows a monthly comparison between February 2024 and 2025 city sales tax collections by NAICS category. Increases and declines are showing an equal split by category. The largest reduction in percentage was Rental and Leasing, down 38%, the largest dollar decline was in Retail Trade \$8,995 compared to the prior year. Remote sales were up 9% over February 2024.

<u>Community Center Fund Charges for Services and Tax Revenues – February 2025</u>

January charges for services (pass fees and recreation programs) were 3% or \$3,000 higher compared to one year ago. Sales and Use tax revenue was flat compared to one year ago.
