AGENDA TEXT: BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS REAPPOINTMENT – A request to approve the reappointment of Dorrie Handley to the Historic Preservation Board for a three-year term to expire in June of 2026

BACKGROUND

Dorrie Handley's term on the Historic Preservation Board expires in June of 2023. On June 14, 2023, Dorrie Handley submitted her application to be reappointed to the Historic Preservation Board. Her vacancy on the Historic Preservation Board has been advertised since April of 2023 and staff has received no other applications.

Mayor Kincaid and Board Liaison Councilor Miller recommend Dorrie Handley's reappointment to the Historic Preservation Board for another three-year term to expire in June of 2026. Pursuant to the term limits provision in the Boards and Commissions Policy adopted by the Fruita City Council on August 4, 2020, Dorrie may apply for one more three-year term before becoming term limited.

If Dorrie Handley is reappointed, there will be no remaining vacancies on the Historic Preservation Board.
