Mayor Jensen called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m.

AGENDA REVIEW

Mayor Pro Tem Ezeonu asked if Council had questions on any agenda items. Mayor Jensen said he would like to table item twenty-nine. Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Johnson said he would like to table items fifteen, twenty-four, twenty-five and forty-five. Deputy City Manager Megan Mahan asked if staff could present item forty-five before deciding to table. Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Johnson confirmed. Mayor Pro Tem Ezeonu asked to clarify items twenty-four and twenty-five. Housing and Neighborhood Services Director Esther Coleman discussed the partnership between the Housing Finance Corporation (HFC) and the owner and noted the pilot is a payment in lieu of tax abatement. Mayor Jensen noted there was a transfer of ownership. City Manager William A. Hills discussed workforce housing and 51% of ownership going to the HFC. He noted the current owner is operating it, discussed a ground lease, 35% annual payment going to the city because this property does not have taxes, and confirmed this is not a traveling HFC. Council Member Shotwell inquired if it includes reduced rates. City Attorney Maleshia McGinnis said she would provide an update. Council Member Headen asked how much should be workforce housing. Mr. Hills said 20-80% should be workforce with rates determined by the TDHCA and varies per property. Mayor Jensen noted others had 10%. Ms. Mahan asked to pull item eighteen from Consent to Individual Consideration to discuss along with item thirty-three. Council Member Shotwell asked to pull item twenty-three to Individual Consideration.

Council Member Shotwell asked for a presentation. City Attorney Maleshia McGinnis reviewed the resolution noting the City of Grand Prairie is a member of the steering committee. She said Oncor filed an application on or about June 26, 2025 with cities retaining original jurisdiction seeking to increase system-wide transmission and distribution rates. The resolution suspends the July 31, 2025 effective date of the Company's rate increase for the maximum period permitted by law to allow the City, working in conjunction with the Steering Committee of Cities served by Oncor, to evaluate the filing, determine whether the filing complies with law, and if lawful, to determine what further strategy, including settlement, to pursue. Council Member Shotwell asked if by doing this the city trying to help average payor. Ms. McGinnis confirmed 170 cities are in the coalition. Council Member Shotwell then moved, seconded by Council Member Headen, to approve this item. The motion carried unanimously.

ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL CONSIDERATION

27. Boards and Commissions appointments for vacancies and terms expiring on July 31, 2025

City Secretary Mona Lisa Galicia presented the nomination list. Council Member Del Bosque asked to consider the nomination of Malcom Chakery for Planning and Zoning Commission separately. Mayor Pro Tem Ezeonu moved, seconded by Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Johnson, to approve all of the nominations except for Mr. Chakery who will be voted on individually. Motion carried unanimously.

Council Member Headen moved, seconded by Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Johnson, to approve her nomination of Mr. Chakery to the Planning and Zoning Commission. Council Member Del Bosque said that Mr. Chakery is not a good representation nor good fit for the Grand Prairie community due to his negative work with minorities. Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Johnson commented that he was in the same position with Dr. Angela Luckey and feels council should continue to support and respect the mayor and council members' appointments and hopes the council member has vetted this nominee to see if they are a good fit. Council Member Headen said Mr. Chakery has served well in the past with no issues on the Park Board and with Keep Grand Prairie Beautiful and has no criminal history. Mayor Pro Tem Ezeonu believes the council member has a right, if a nominee is not right for a position, that they have a right to vote against.

Ms. McGinnis noted the purpose of this item is to consider acceptance of the Special Commissioner's award of compensation to the City for condemnation of said property in the amount of \$59,310. Council Member Clemson moved, seconded by Council Member Adams to approve this item. The motion carried unanimously.

Transportation Director Caryl Devries and Transit Manager Monica Law reviewed the Grand Connection budget. Mayor Jensen called for speakers and there were none. Mayor Pro Tem Ezeonu moved, seconded by Council Member Adams, to close the public hearing and approve this item. The motion carried unanimously.

Deputy City Manager Megan Mahan presented items eighteen and thirty-three together, noting item eighteen is a development agreement and thirty-three is a public hearing. She noted item forty-five is a companion case. Ms. Mahan explained it would annex property into the city and item forty-five is the zoning case. Planning Director and Assistant Planning Director Rashad Jackson and Savannah Ware discussed the plan for a training center and advised this cannot be developed into cryptocurrency mining. They reviewed development standards. Ms. McGinnis noted the developer is waiving rights in item eighteen. Mayor Jensen discussed Senate Bill 840. Matt Moore, 4215 W. Lovers Ln, Suite 250, Dallas, spoke in support. Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Johnson asked if there are spacing requirements for data centers and how they are cooled. Mr. Moore said he is not aware of that requirement and advised they utilize a closed air loop system. Johnson said his concern was about water use; but since it is not water cooled, he no longer has that concern. Council Member Del Bosque asked if there was a need for noise barriers. Mr. Moore said no.

Patsy Ray, 2217 El Paso, spoke on this item neutrally and asked how many properties are being considered and what revenue would come for the city. Mayor Jensen confirmed only this property tonight and it depends on what is built there and taxed. Council Member Shotwell asked to clarify the development agreement. Ms. Mahan discussed rights being waived under the senate bill and agreeing to the development standards.

Specific Use Permit for a contractor shop with outside storage with heavy equipment in an existing industrial development on 19.27 acres. Lot 1, Block 1, Zachary Addition, City of Grand Prairie, Dallas County, zoned Light Industrial (LI) District, within SH 161 Corridor Overlay, and addressed as 502 W Oakdale Rd (On June 23, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval by a vote of 7-0)

Ms. Ware presented this Specific Use Permit (SUP) item for a contractor shop with outside storage with heavy equipment in an existing industrial development. She reviewed SUP requirements, provided an aerial view and street view of property. MEI Industrial Solutions (MEI) is relocating from another city to Grand Prairie. MEI is a specialty contractor, providing value-add services in the areas of machinery moving, specialty crating and packaging, specialized transportation and delivery/installation services. MEI's operations involve the outside storage of large equipment and machinery. MEI receives components that are temporarily stored on-site until they are prepped and delivered to construction sites. MEI uses specialized equipment to deliver customer equipment for installation at its final destination. She noted the secondary access point will be utilized for Zachary Construction's operations. Additionally, a fence is proposed between the portion of the lot to be used by Zachary Construction. She reviewed their Operational Plan. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval with the following conditions: Development of the property and delineation of uses shall generally comply with proposed site plan; the applicant shall provide a dumpster enclosure measuring a minimum 12 ft. x 12 ft. (inside measurements) that complies with Article 8 of the UDC. The Development Review Committee (DRC) recommends approval with the same conditions plus a third: Expansion of parking areas beyond what is depicted in Exhibit B – Site Plan, shall comply with paving standards as determined by Engineering and PHEQ Departments.

Maxwell Fisher (Applicant), 2502 Grandview Dr, spoke in support. He reviewed the site plan and noted their headquarters is in Coppell, Texas. Mr. Fisher reviewed discussed operations and business hours and discussed outside storage of large equipment. He advised the fence screens outside storage. Council Member Clemson moved, seconded by Council Member Adams, to close the public hearing and approve with conditions. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Jackson presented this item to allow for two residential units, reviewed zoning requirements and advised P&Z recommended approval. He noted staff is unable to support because use does not align with the Future Land Use Map (FLUM). Council Member Shotwell asked to clarify if single family is in the surrounding area, single family. Mr. Jackson confirmed there is one building with two units. Kobi McDade, 3722 Constitution Dr, spoke in support of this item. He noted it is family owned property with other family members on adjacent property. Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Johnson noted neighbors do seem concerned since there was no one present to speak. Patsy Ray, 2214 El Paso St, recorded her support of this item. Council Member Clemson said new development there will add to area. She then moved, seconded by Council Member Adams, to close the public hearing and approve items thirty-six and thirty-seven. The motion carried unanimously.

He reviewed variances requested, and he noted P&Z and staff approve. Mayor Jensen asked if they do not do this, will it sit vacant. Mr. Jackson confirmed. Council Member Headen moved, seconded by Council

Member Adams, to close the public hearing and approve this item. There were no speakers. The motion carried unanimously.

Beeman Survey, Abstract No. 126, City of Grand Prairie, Dallas County, Texas, zoned PD-288 and PD-29, within the SH 161 and IH 20 Corridor Overlay Districts, and addressed as 13 Sara Jane Pkwy and 2000 IH 20 (On June 9, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval by a vote of 8-0)

Mr. Jackson presented items thirty-nine and forty together. The proposed amendment is for high density residential multi-family. He advised P&Z recommended approval. For the zoning case Mr. Jackson reviewed existing zoning and the proposed zoning for PD multifamily, and a conceptual building. He advised P&Z recommends with approval and staff recommends approval and notes that multi-family is currently allowed by the existing zoning and most of the site already has a FLUM designation of High Density Residential. Mayor Pro Tem Ezeonu asked if they can build four stories and Mr. Jackson confirmed, under current standards. Council Member Shotwell asked if they have to go through this. Mr. Jackson said a civil permit will be required. There was discussion on max allowable height, whether an ordinance needs to be corrected for twenty covered parking. Council Member Lopez asked if it is one parcel. Mr. Jackson said two PD's, one lot, two parcels.

Daniel Box, Attorney with Winstead, 2728 N. Harwood, #500, Dallas, spoke in support. Ashley Bedell, 401 Pennsylvania Parkway, Indianapolis, IN, spoke in support. Ms. Bedell discussed core values, culture and team, reviewed exterior elevations, finishes, masonry and amenities, the establishment of a sense of community, discussed site plan with four story building along Sara Jane Pkwy, building typology; concept for amenities; a dog park. Mr. Box discussed zoning appropriate for use, FLUM surrounding High Density Residential and requesting to unify zoning of site. Mayor Pro Tem Ezeonu advised the corridor buildings typology is not attractive. Mr. Jackson noted the images are 2D and the photos are more 3D. Council Member Headen discussed the site plan phase to review building concepts. Council Member Clemson noted Interstate 20 is important and council wants it to look excellent. Council Member Shotwell asked if they plan to have this gated and noted Police has a couple of programs to consider, and if gated there is a license plate reader program system that could be helpful in design. Ms. Bedell confirmed. Council Member Headen asked if Garrett are builders and developers. Ms. Bedell confirmed said depending on the market, they assume holding their properties. Council Member Headen moved, seconded by Deputy Mayor Pro Tem Johnson, to table items thirty-nine and forty to the next meeting. Council Member Shotwell made a correction noting they are recommending 70% covered parking. The motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Jackson presented this SUP request noting the owner is separating from the franchise and is adding an entertainment component. Mayor Jensen called for speakers and there were none. Mr. Jackson advised P&Z recommended approval with conditions: Operations shall be in compliance with TDSHS – Texas Food Establishment Rules and Local Ordinances regarding food service; no live music shall be allowed outdoors. Live music played indoors shall not be

amplified on outdoor speakers. Mr. Jackson reviewed their operational plan and floor plan. Council Member Headen moved, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Ezeonu, to close the public hearing and approve this item. The motion carried unanimously.

CPA-25-05-0009– Comprehensive Plan Amendment – Amend the 2018 Comprehensive Plan by updating the Master Thoroughfare Plan and Map to remove a planned Collector, 2-lane Undivided (C2U) roadway located between E Tarrant Road and IH 30 EB Frontage Road east of Stadium Drive (On June 23, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval by a vote of 5-2) A proposed SUP/Site Plan for a multi-family project has been designed so that removal of the road is necessary. While staff believes the area would be better with the road, the Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) states that the removal of this proposed Master Thoroughfare Plan road from the Plan would not negatively impact the area.

Transportation Planner Brett Huntsman presented this item to remove the two lane undivided roadway to allow for development and noted a Traffic Impact Analysis was used, and results of the analysis proposed shared access drive. He recommended this with item along with item forty-four.

Mr. Jackson Rashad presented item forty-four. He reviewed the site plan with seven buildings, the landscape plan and building elevations. Mr. Jackson discussed requested variances, noting the proposed use aligns with the general location of multi-family per the long-range Gateway Concept Plan, but the elevations of the project are inconsistent with the design goals for the Gateway Plan area. He advised P&Z recommended approval with conditions: the project shall meet the minimum requirement for site trees; the applicant shall provide a tree survey and mitigation plan with the application for a Final Plat; Council Member Shotwell reviewed variances, footprint of buildings, tree survey and providing credit for cleaning out junk trees.

Scott Miller, 7902 Briar Brook, spoke in support. He discussed multifamily development at Beltline and I-30, noting he has worked with Council Member Shotwell on the design of the plan. Mr. Miller advised he is withdrawing his request for variance on trees and advised it is densely wooded on the single family side. Council Member Lopez asked to clarify the rendering, noted the Omni Plan bar is set high and asked if there is a way to make them look better. Mr. Miller advised the four residential buildings front Interstate 30 and they are building high quality elevation, using close to 30% glazing. Council Member Del Bosque noted this is the entertainment district and they do not want to settle. Mr. Miller advised the image is what he is planning to build. There was discussion on the number of apartments. Council Member Shotwell advised each end of the building has the appearance of three story buildings. Sandy Disbrow, did not wish to speak but recorded support. Council Member Shotwell moved, seconded by Council Member Headen, to close the public hearing and approve items forty-three and forty-four allowing all variances and minimum trees at 150. Council Member Johnson asked to substitute the motion to require the required number of trees. It failed for a lack of second to the amended motion. Council Member Lopez asked the applicant to work with staff to see what other enhancements – maybe more lighting and stone – can be included. Council Member Shotwell’s motion passed unanimously.
