Kiesler Wellness Center


The Donor Tree

(Budget \$22,000)



The benches will also be placed strategically around town displaying the picture grace and the lettering of BOVEY bringing the pieces together as a piece of art to be found around the town – as well as – beautiful places for everyone to sit and enjoy all the beauty that Bovey has to offer.
