I am very excited about this potential opportunity since I am a professional artist, with numerous public art sculptures throughout northern Minnesota. I currently live in International Falls, on beautiful Rainy Lake, where I receive much of my inspiration and artist energy.

I work primarily with Metal and I often incorporate local rock into my creations, as well. Both of these materials are very well suited for our harsh northern climate and result in sculptures that lend themselves very well to being erected in outdoor settings. If a piece requires painting for additional color, I typically use oil-based enamels that wear well and do not require constant attention and maintenance with normal, year-round exposure.

My previous experiences with publicly-commissioned artworks have been overwhelmingly fulfilling and exciting to me as an artist. I love to work with the person(s) or commissioning board during the concept development. I absolutely love the brainstorming energy that typically abounds during the early phase. I especially appreciate incorporating the custom design (or theme) that a group, or town, or even regional history adds to the core of the piece, resulting in a truly unique creation. But the most satisfying aspect of a commissioned public piece for me is starting with a concept and seeing it through to the dedication and then seeing the public's reaction to a new, special piece of artwork in their community where they live, work, and play.

I have a proven record of creating public art, from start to finish, on-time, and within budget. My "other" skills (developed over decades) such as large project management, engineering design, and extensive experience in construction, allow me a unique blend of skills that I can draw from in order to take a project from concept to installation and completion.

I hope you will find my supporting documentation pertinent and interesting, and I certainly look forward to the potential opportunity to working with you (and your team) on this exciting new project!

**Image 1 Title: Cathy Johnson “SUMMER” Memorial Sculpture**

**Description:** Commissioned by the Northland Arts Society as a memorial to Cathy Johnson (local artist). Local school kids submitted ideas for the sculpture and I was selected by committee to execute the piece. **Date:** 2016. **Medium:** New and recycled metal, concrete, wood, tile, enamel **Size:** 7’ tall. **Budget:** \$5,000. **Location:** Int’l Falls Public Library grounds

**Image 2 Title: “AUTUMN” Sculpture**

**Description:** Recycled metal bars configured into the image of a tree losing its leaves. The leaves are brightly colored stained glass and hang so they move in the breeze. Local rocks used for the base. **Date:** 2017. **Medium:** Recycled metal, concrete, stained-glass, Rainy Lake rocks, enamel. **Size:** 12’ tall. **Budget:** \$6,000 **Location:** Int’l Falls Public Library grounds

**Image 3 Title: “WINTER” Sculpture**

**Description:** Made of metal with blown-glass eyes to depict a fierce, “Old Man Winter” with dangling snowflakes that move in the wind. Mounted atop a custom concrete pole. **Date:** 2017. **Medium:** Recycled metal, concrete, glass, enamel. **Size:** 14’ tall. **Budget:** \$12,000 **Location:** Int’l Falls Public Library grounds

**Image 4 Title: SPRING**

**Description:** Metal sculpture of the rising sun shining on 5 growing spring flowers. The tallest “flower” is a whimsical pinwheel that rotates in the wind. Piece is permanently set in a mortared rock flowerbed that serves as a bench. **Date:** Aug 2018. **Medium:** Metal & local bedrock. **Size:** 8’ tall x 8’ wide. **Budget:** \$12,000. **Location:** Int’l Falls Public Library grounds

**Image 5 Title: TREE Of LIFE**

**Description:** Metal sculpture depicting various outdoor elements important to the Baudette Community and lifestyle. **Date:** 2018 **Medium:** Metal and enamel paint **Size:** 15’ tall x 10’ wide **Budget:** \$6,000 **Location:** Outside the Baudette Public Library

**Image 6 Title: MINING KNOWLEDGE**

**Description:** Colorful, over-sized books piled up in an antiquated-looking mining cart on tracks. **Date:** 2021. **Medium:** Metal and wood **Size:** 5’ tall x 4’ wide x 6’ wide. **Budget:** \$6,500 **Location:** Eveleth Public Library Grounds

**Image 7 Title: BOOK DROP**

**Description:** Colorful, Metal “Books” arranged to appear as if they are falling into the Library’s book return box. **Date:** 2022. **Medium:** Metal and enamel paint. **Size:** 10’ tall **Budget:** \$3,500 **Location:** Mountain Iron, Public Library Headquarters

**Image 8 Title: MIDNITE BLOOM**

**Description:** Metal flowers. **Date:** 2022. **Medium:** Metal. **Size:** 7’ tall. **Cost:** \$3200

**Image 9 Title: NORDERN PIKE**

**Description:** This piece is a metal, 3-dimensional fish sculpture mounted on a Rainy Lake rock base. **Date:** 2014. **Medium:** Recycled Sheet metal **Size:** 5’ long. **Location:** Private collection

**Image 10 Title: RAINY LAKE ROCK FISH2**

**Description:** Sculpture made of Rainy Lake rocks that I collected on the shoreline and wrapped with welded metal. **Date:** 2021 **Medium:** Local Lake Rocks and Metal **Size:** 32” long, 15” Tall **Location:** Currently for sale \$625
