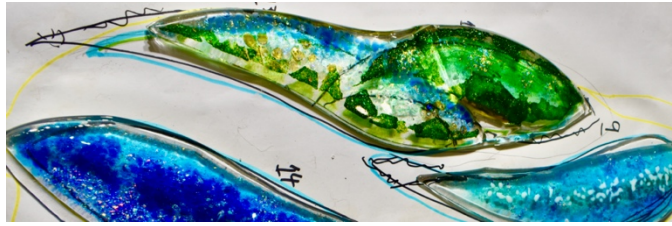

Grand Rapids Social Cohesion Sculpture Project

We are very interested in returning to Grand Rapids to take part in your Social Cohesion Sculpture Project. We believe that a community is like a school of diverse fish—stronger together. We envision collaborating with your citizens to create a sculpture that celebrates the people of Grand Rapids. The final work would be designed, fabricated and installed in partnership with the community. It would be by, and for, the people. Those who could not participate, could watch the process on our website, where we document our projects with video, photos, text, and sound. This process creates a sense of ownership for all.

We have extensive experience building sculptures in partnership with communities. With *Ocean/Wave*, for Midwest Special Services (MSS), this community of Special Needs Adults led the design process. We began by facilitating a series of painting & poetry workshops in which members were invited to create works of art based on their lives. MSS is located on Ocean Avenue in St Paul and, during the group poem workshop, one of the participants said that being blind was like living your life at the edge of an ocean and being buffeted by waves but not being pulled out with the tide.

The metaphor inspired the group. We then built upon this idea with a specially adapted painting workshop in which community members painted their own “wave” based on *The Great Wave of Kanagawa* by Katsushika Hokusai. This painting/design workshop generated a mural for their community space and suggested the image and coloration of the final bronze that we’d been commissioned to make. *Ocean/Wave*, a bronze wave sculpture patinated in shades of blue, became the inaugural work of the MSS Sculpture Park.

With our *Lake of Dreams* project, we collaborated with the people of Lake Street neighborhood in Minneapolis to honor the Martin Luther King’s quote, “We may have all come on different ships but we’re in the same boat now.” Working with community concerns, business owners, area schools, libraries, and residents we held a series of workshops in which the community created dozens of illuminated boats, the largest of which was covered with more than 300 instant photos of the people those who live and work in the neighborhood and wanted to welcome each other to the “boat” of America. Some of the photos show families, with several children, shouting “Welcome!”

For the community of Grand Rapids, it would be our intent to host a series of design workshops, using art events such as poetry and mural painting, or glass and bronze workshops, to inspire the design of a component-based outdoor sculpture in which all will be invited to fabricate an individual element for inclusion in the final piece. We have recently been working with shatter-resistant kiln-formed glass, a durable and vibrant material well-proven for Public Art. *Sky/Stream*, a 250ft sculptural relief commissioned by Bellingham, Washington, is just one of our many works in this inspiring material.

We defy gravity with joy. Many thanks for your kind consideration.

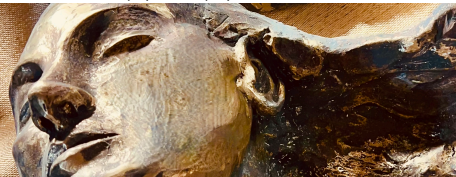

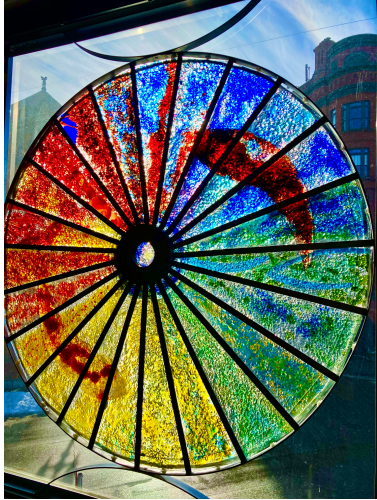
