This interactive sculpture honors the life of Ted Betts, Sr., who started the Ted Betts Ice And Fuel Company in 1902.



It is at this very spot where ice harvesters floated large sawn blocks of ice to a ramp, where a large iron clamp would grab it.

Two belgian horses, named Bill and Dick, would drag two tons of ice up the wooden ramp into the massive icehouse.

The icehouse, three-quarters of a city block long and sixty feet wide, would hold the ice, stacked nine to ten layers high with a deep coat of sawdust insulating it from the summer heat.
