8. Appeal of Sign Exception Application 25PLN-0031 at 2001 Nevada City Highway.

<u>CEQA</u>: Exempt under CEQA Guideline §15301, Categorical Exemption Class 1 ("Existing Facilities")

<u>Recommendation</u>: That Council 1) find the project Categorically Exempt pursuant to Section 15301, Class 1, of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and Guidelines, as detailed in the staff report; 2) review appeal made by the applicant; and 3) determine whether to overturn or uphold the planning commission's decision to deny the internal illumination of the "Shell" symbol on the two canopies at three locations and on the monument price sign at 2001 Nevada City Highway.

Amy Wolfson, City Planner, gave a presentation to the council.

The applicant had difficulty joining the meeting.

BRIEF REPORTS BY COUNCIL MEMBERS

Councilmember Bonomolo shared he'll attend a solid waste meeting and expects the next skate park ad hoc meeting soon, noting community feedback on road conditions and encouraging patience as improvements continue. Councilmember Ivy highlighted attending the Nevada County Sustainability Summit, Briar Patch EV charger unveiling, and meetings on trail connectivity and future roundabout planning. Councilmember Arbuckle reported attending the GVDA/Chamber board meeting, ERC summit, and state conferences, where she was re-elected to the League of California Cities board and emphasized advocating for rural communities. Vice Mayor Caravelli spoke about the ERC summit, meetings with Habitat for Humanity, the Common Resource Center opening, and Sierra Harvest events. Mayor Hodge reflected on positive regional economic forecasts, small business growth, the resiliency summit, arts and housing innovation, and reminded the public of "Wednesdays with the Mayor" open office hours. The meeting adjourned after closing remarks.
