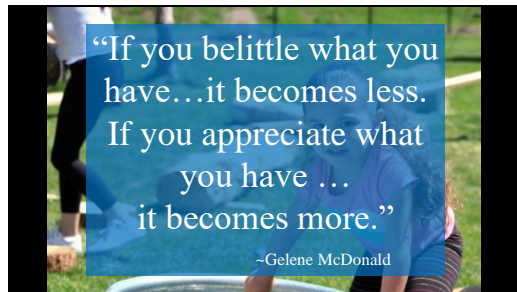

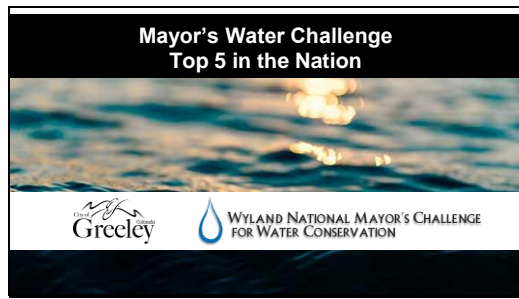

Greeley residents have done it again! Greeley finish 5th in the Wyland National Mayor’s Challenge for Water Conservation with 4,696 pledges resulting in a water savings of 19 million gallons of water and stopping 1,108 pounds of hazardous waste from entering our watersheds. Greeley has been awarded a top ten finish since the beginning of the Challenge in 2012.
