Title:

Consideration of a resolution of the Greeley City Council officially naming a new skate park at 3rd Street and 11th Avenue as “3rd Street Plaza”

Summary:

As new parks are developed, park locations must include a naming process. The City’s standard naming process is to have the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board collect suggestions and make a final recommendation to City Council through a Resolution. In this case, the P&R Board wanted staff to solicit suggestions from the general public through social media. This was done through a variety of methods and staff collected over 20 suggestions to be considered by the Board.

In addition, staff and consultants from New Line Skateparks, Inc, the selected consultant designer and contractor for a network of three new skate parks, hosted a series of public input sessions which were heavily attended. Through an informal straw poll, the general consensus of approximately 60 wheeled sports enthusiasts (skaters, bladers, scooter riders, cyclists) was to recognize the new space as “3rd Street Plaza”.

After discussion, the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board recommended at its May 3, 2019 regular meeting, by an 8-0 vote, to name this new skate location as the “3rd Street Plaza”.
