



Career Readiness: This program is proud of its community partnerships, provides field trips, vocational assessments, and teaches resume writing and mentorships for career exploration. Students also have the opportunity to earn their Food Handler's Certification and OSHA 10 Construction Safety Certification. Our students flourish with this program and have the capability to job hunt. We also encourage our students to give back to the community through community service with other non- profits in the community. This has proven to be an enriching experience for all involved as it taps into their compassion, humbleness and self-confidence.

Support/Case Management: Each student is assigned a case manager who work closely with families through monthly Care Meetings where progress in all aspects of the student's development at the program and at home. Families have access to talk to his case manager at all times. Goals and strategies are developed to improve family dynamics. Throughout the year, we celebrate holidays together and pride ourselves with being a support to the family holistically.

<u>Family Services</u>: Families have the opportunity to participate in Family Services where a family support counselor works with the entire family in the home for approximately 10- 12 sessions to help them overcome barriers for successful communication and relationships.

The Council for Boys & Young Men - All youth admitted to the program will be assigned to The Council for Boys and Young Men (The Council). The structured group model utilizes experiential activities, reflection, and group dialogue to address masculine topics.
