Electric Utility Department Capital Projects:

13kV to 23kv Conversion – US17 from Harbor Road to CR 315

Planning for this project has begun. This project will continue the Chapman 1 and Chapman 2 circuits north of Harbor Road to provide capacity and reliability for existing and future customers north of Governors Creek. Materials for this project are being funded by a DEO Grant. Materials have arrived and are being installed. We have installed all materials except for one commercial customer that will require an outage, and we are working with the customers to obtain a time we can both agree on to do the swap over. We are to the point and then we will soon finish taking the wire down all the way to Harbor Rd.

Northend of town Conversion

The month of January we pulled in new wire in the neighborhoods off 209 between River Rd and Blackmon St. and started converting all the houses in this neighborhood to the new 23Kv voltage. We have converted all the customers on CR209 all the way up to just north of Blackmon St. We are currently using Blackmon St. to keep the old voltage energized as we work our way through the neighborhood converting everyone to the new voltage. We have also taken down all the old wire and equipment off the poles on CR209 from Mahama Bluff Rd. south to just north of Blackmon St. and we will pull all the old poles along this route as soon as AT&T and Comcast get off these poles. After we convert all the side roads we will continue south on 209.

Rookery Subdivision

The month of January we pulled in cables on a road off the main road of Peace Blvd., we also set transformers and terminated the primary cable and made up the streetlight circuit for this road. This road was part of 2B that was not yet completed when we were terminating during the month of December.
