Electric Utility Department Capital Projects:

13kV to 23kv Conversion – US17 from Harbor Road to CR 315

Planning for this project has begun. This project will continue the Chapman 1 and Chapman 2 circuits north of Harbor Road to provide capacity and reliability for existing and future customers north of Governors Creek. Materials for this project are being funded by a DEO Grant. Materials have arrived and are being installed. We have installed all materials except for one commercial customer that will require an outage, and we are working with the customers to obtain a time we can both agree on to do the swap over. We are to the point and then we will soon finish taking the wire down all the way to Harbor Rd.

Northend of town Conversion

The month of February we pulled in new wire in the neighborhoods off 209 between River Rd and Blackmon St. and finished converting all the houses in this neighborhood to the new 23Kv voltage. We have converted all the customers on CR209 all the way up to just north of Blackmon Street. We have also taken down all the old wire and equipment off the poles in the neighborhood of River Rd and Blackmon St.; we will pull all the old poles along this route as soon as AT&T and Comcast get off these poles. Now that we have converted all the side roads we will continue south on 209.

Rookery Subdivision

The month of February we pulled in cables off the main road of Peace Blvd., we also set transformers and terminated the primary cable and made up the streetlight circuit for this road. This month we also pulled secondary cables from transformer's to secondary pull boxes.
