- Grandparents of a student came to the school to meet with me. They informed me of some things that was going on at home that included possible mental abuse and that the child may be cutting themselves. Due to the student living outside of the city limits, the grandparents and the school counselor called the DCF hotline. DCF responded and met with the student and mother here at the school and determined it was safe for the student to return home.
