Captain Roderick V. Little, a native of San Diego, graduated from Samuel F.B. Morse High School in 1982. He enlisted in the Navy in 1987. In October 2000, he was commissioned as an ensign under the Limited Duty Officer program in October 2000. He earned a Bachelor's of Science degree in Criminology with a minor in Homeland Security.

Following Recruit Training at RTC/NTC San Diego, he attended Seamanship Apprentice Training, becoming a undesignated seaman. His enlisted tours include plankowner on USS Wisconsin (BB-64), USS Savannah (AOR-4), USS America (CV-66), USS Monongahela (AO-178), and EWTGLANT UNREP School, Joint Expeditionary Base Little Creek Norfolk, Virginia.

Assignments since commissioning include Replenishment-At-Sea Officer aboard USS Detroit (AOE 4), Ship's Boatswain's aboard USS Seattle (AOE 3), Detachment officer-in-charge at Assault Craft Unit Two, First Lieutenant aboard USS Iwo Jima (LHD 7), Bravo Company Commander and maritime prepositioning force officer with Amphibious

Construction Battalion Two, landing craft officer for Assault Craft Unit Two, first lieutenant aboard USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN 71), Deck Division inspector at the Board of Inspection and Survey office, First Lieutenant aboard USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (CVN 69), and Port Operations officer at Naval Station Norfolk, Virginia.

He has completed eight overseas deployments in support of various operations around the world to include: Desert Shield, Desert Storm, Hurricane Katrina relief operations, Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, and Inherent Resolve.

In August 2020, he became the sixth commanding officer of Transient Personnel Unit/Pre-Trial Confinement Facility Jacksonville. Currently serving as Executive Officer at Southeast Regional Maintenance Center (SERMC).
