

Sec. 62-138. - Alcoholic beverages prohibited.

Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in the parks or recreation facilities is prohibited, except as follows:

- (1) Commercial cruise line-type vessels docked at the city pier may lawfully possess alcoholic beverages and, if otherwise legally authorized, may allow consumption of alcohol during the time from one-half hour before departure until their return and dockage of their vessel.
- (2) The city council may approve the serving, possession, and consumption of beer and wine (collectively referred to hereafter as serving or serve alcohol) at city-sponsored special events at Spring Park under the following conditions:
 - a. Alcoholic beverages shall be limited to beer and wine.
 - b. The serving of alcohol shall not exceed four continuous hours and may not continue beyond sunset without specific city council approval.
 - c. Serving alcohol shall be strictly limited to one city council-approved designated area (hereafter alcohol beverage zone). Appropriate signage shall be prominently displayed at all times while alcohol is served. Such signage shall, at a minimum, prohibit leaving the alcohol beverage zone with any alcoholic beverage open container at any time.
 - d. A city police officer must be present at the event during times when alcohol is served.
 - e. Food service must be available at the event during times when alcohol is served,
 - f. The city shall be named as an additional insured on the liquor and general liability insurance policies furnished to the city by the entity authorized by the state to serve alcohol or the entity that has requested the city to allow the serving of alcohol. The limits for such insurance shall be approved by the city attorney.
 - g. Reserved.
 - h. An appropriate state beverage permit, as well as other permits and licenses for the event, if required, must be secured by the vendor, caterer or responsible party and a copy furnished to the city in advance of the special event.
 - i. When reviewing the request for serving alcohol hereunder, the city council shall have the authority to require additional conditions for the event to ensure compliance with this chapter and for the safety of those in attendance.
 - j. The city manager or his designee shall have the authority to terminate the serving of alcohol at the event should a violation of this chapter occur.
