RE: Consideration of Resolution 29-2025, a Resolution Awarding 2025 Cairns Asphalt Paving Project

Background

The Town has \$25,000 budgeted in the Public Works Capital Paving fund (10-931-921) for road improvements in 2025. We solicited bids for a paving project on Cairns Avenue, with New West Paving submitting the low bid of \$36,550. The second bid, from Acord Asphalt, came in at \$38,884.

Through a partnership with Hodapp Homes, who are responsible for repairing a road cut in the area, we propose extending the project scope to improve a larger stretch of Cairns Avenue. Specifically, this project would pave from the end of the existing asphalt near Deven Haven south to the north side of Grand Lake Lane.

Under this cost-sharing agreement:

- The Town would contribute \$20,000 from the \$25,000 currently budgeted.
- Hodapp Homes would contribute \$16,550 toward the total cost.
- The combined funding would fully cover the New West Paving bid. This partnership benefits both parties: it improves a longer section of road than originally planned and reduces the per-square-foot paving cost for Hodapp Homes compared to a standalone repair.

Bids in order of price.

	New West Paving	\$36,550.00
2.	Acord Asphalt	\$38,884.00
