- B. Dean Knuth's appointment has been approved and he has been sworn in as a Commission member. Welcome Dean!

New Business:

- C. The City has approved the fall tree giveaway. There will be 50 trees on a first come, first served basis. They have asked for our input on tree selection. Knuth suggests that we use native species such as Sassafras, Hickory and Slippery Elm. The Eastern Redbud was very popular last year. Knuth and Skorupski have offered to help with planting the trees.
- D. There was some discussion of the Memorial Tree program and its future. We believe that there is a conflict in promoting the program when we have many memorial markers that citizens have previously paid for to memorialize a loved one that are in storage due to the trees having been removed from the City Hall property. Councilman Koester believes that there will not be enough replacement trees planted on the City Hall property to accommodate all the markers. One proposal includes displaying the markers in a collective form, such as a circle around a central tree. We believe that the markers should be paired one for one with trees, and that donors should be contacted to determine their preferences.

Motion made by Meyering, seconded by Galbo to suspend meeting in July and August and meet next on September 2. It passed by the following vote.
