Re: DPW Monthly Report

1. The wastewater treatment plant was in compliance for the month of May.

- 2. We are waiting on Biotech to perform the spring sludge haul. They did not haul our sludge soon enough and now the field that has used for us has been planted for the spring. They are trying to find another field for us to use as soon as possible because we only have enough storage for two more weeks.
- 3. We have been trying out a wet well air injection system to reduce odor and eliminate FOG at the Kress Rd. pump station. After sixty days of use, we have found that it has been excellent at removing FOG and has kept the odor in check, showing some improvement from typical conditions. We feel the odor reduction will be even greater once this device is also installed at an upstream pump station. We feel comfortable in purchasing this equipment for two of our pump stations as the elimination of FOG alone will allow the injection system to pay for itself in five years. This does not even take into account the odor reduction benefits, which are harder to quantify, yet extremely important as well.
