Where History Meets Technology

Then and now, tools help us make, mend, and share. This vintage treadle sewing machine and modern printer make a playful but practical pairing: one represents the foot-powered ingenuity of the past, while the other reflects today's quick, digital way of producing information.

History note - A treadle sewing machine uses a foot pedal to turn a wheel and belt, powering the needle



without electricity. In homes and shops, machines like this helped people sew clothing, repair textiles, and create household items long before electric machines became common.

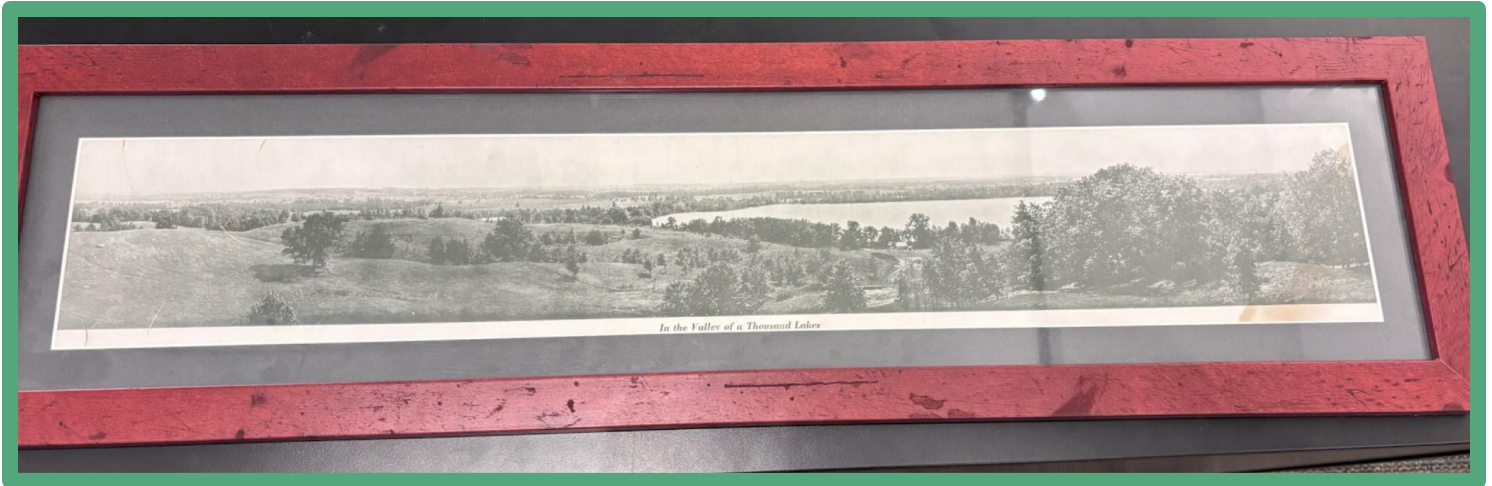


What a fun knitting adventure in July when coaches Denise and Pat share some hat knitting ideas with a couple of young knitters.
