### RESOLUTION SUPPORTING SPEED LIMIT REDUCTION ON CORDLEY LAKE ROAD

At a regular meeting of the Township Board of Trustees, held at the Hamburg Township Hall located at 10405 Merrill Road, Hamburg Township, Livingston County, Michigan, on March 17, 2026 beginning at 7:00 p.m., there were:

#### RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS**, the Hamburg Township Board of Trustees has an obligation to ensure the health, general welfare and safety of the residents of Hamburg Township; and

**WHEREAS**, Cordley Lake Road between Kress and Songbird Lane is a paved county highway approximately one mile in length; and

**WHEREAS**, the existing posted speed limit on Cordley Lake Road between Kress and Songbird Lane is forty-five miles per hour; and

**WHEREAS**, there have been seven traffic crashes reported to the Hamburg Township Public Safety Department on this portion of Kress Road since July 27, 2023 as well as evidence of multiple unreported vehicle road runoffs; and

**WHEREAS**, Michigan law (to wit: MCL 257, 628 et seq.) allows for a township board to petition the county road commission or the department of state police for a proposed change in the speed limit on a county highway; and

**WHEREAS**, the Hamburg Township Board of Trustees has made a determination that a speed limit reduction may be warranted on Cordley Lake Road between Kress Road and Songbird Lane in order for vehicular and pedestrian traffic on that portion of Kress Road to travel in a reasonable and safe manner under the conditions found to exist upon that part of the highway.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:** that the Hamburg Township Board of Trustees hereby recommends and requests that the Michigan Department of Transportation and/or the Michigan Department of State Police perform a comprehensive traffic study, in compliance with MCL 257.628, along that portion of Cordley Lake Road between Kress Road and Songbird Lane to determine if a more appropriate and lower speed limit should be established.
