- Kelmann Restoration partnered with Harrison Fire-Rescue to provide complimentary hydrosonic cleaning for our facepieces and apparatus seating. This service helps reduce personnel exposure to carcinogens and other contaminants that can remain on equipment after fire responses, supporting long-term firefighter health and cancer-risk reduction.
 - Harrison Fire-Rescue received a Nationwide Insurance grant, in partnership with the National Education Center for Agricultural Safety (NECAS), to support grain bin rescue training and equipment. Training was completed in Harrison and we now have grain bin rescue equipment.
 - Personnel assisted Neenah/Menasha and Fox Crossing with tornado disaster response on July 27th. Fire and EMS crews primarily responded to emergency calls from Station 36.
 - Harrison Fire-Rescue welcomed a new member, firefighter Anthony VanDenHeuvel following Fire Commission approval.
