



Public Works Report

March 2025

CITY & STREETS MAINTENANCE

Cleanup and maintenance: Public Works crew did more work on the irrigation lines on the planter strips down Central Street. Blading was done on Cook Avenue. Blading was also done on Water Canyon Road to BLM land, Mulberry Street from Uzona Avenue to the highway, Boxelder Street from Uzona Avenue to the highway, Cottonwood Street Uzona Avenue to the highway, Field Avenue, and Utah Avenue from Mulberry Street to the highway. Potholes were filled on Canyon Street, Jessop Avenue, Newel Avenue, Memorial Street, Hildale Street, Township Avenue, Colvin Street, Barlow Street, Apple Avenue, and Richard Street. The valve line was dug up on Johnson Avenue so the water lines could be located. An irrigation line on Barlow Street was repaired, due to being hit. Landscape maintenance was done at the Colorado City Townhall and Police department. Crew members are currently adding sidewalks on Maple Street.

In March, a total of 56,200 gallons of water was used on the roads.

Sign replacement and addition: Public Works replaced signs on Pioneer Street and Warren Avenue, Pioneer Street and Black Avenue, Black Avenue and Barlow Street, and Edson Avenue and Carling Street.

Screen Plant Operations: The belt on the crusher had some repairs done. A total of 1,228 yards of base was made with 383 yards going to Tom Holm for cinder haul trade. 84 yards of base were delivered to

Dave Lane as trade for a landfill toolbox, GMC wheels, a jump jack, and 55 gallons of DEF.

PARKS AND RECREATION

Heritage Park: The water was turned on, any leaks were repaired, and sprinkler heads were set. Regular Park maintenance was done, including trash clean up, lawn care etc.

Lauritzen Park: The water was turned on, any leaks were repaired, and sprinkler heads were set. Regular Park maintenance was done, including trash clean up, lawn care etc.

EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR

The rear shock was replaced on police vehicle #1102. Police vehicle #1103 had all four tires replaced. A LOF inspection was done on Hildale's vehicle #3242. A water pump leak was repaired on dump truck vehicle #2203. A new concrete pad is being added to the Public Works shop.

LANDFILL

The landfill is currently working on a more efficient billing system, that will allow customers to pay their bills electronically.

In March, 865.06 tons of garbage were taken to the landfill.

ADMINISTRATIVE

Public Works director and admin team attended a meeting with Washington County to discuss grants for Hildale streets and roads. The

Public Works team has been working with Jonah Paynter and his team with ByteQuarry in developing a more efficient and user-friendly Public Works data software to replace IworQs. We are aiming to begin implementing this new software within the next few weeks.
