ORDINANCE

Directing Removal or Demolishment of Structure and Notice Regarding Occupation

WHEREAS, the Hillsborough Board of Commissioners finds that the structure described herein is unfit for human habitation and dangerous to the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Hillsborough pursuant to the minimum housing code of the Town of Hillsborough, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the town's contracted code enforcement officer has verified that all of the procedures of the town's minimum housing ordinance have been complied with; and

WHEREAS, this structure should be removed or demolished as directed by the code enforcement officer and should be placarded by placing thereon a notice prohibiting use for human habitation; and

WHEREAS, the owners and parties in interest of this structure have been given a reasonable opportunity to bring the structure up to the standards of the Town's Minimum Housing Ordinance pursuant to an order issued by the Code Enforcement Officer on March 31, 2026, and the owners have failed to comply with the order.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Hillsborough Board of Commissioners ordains:

Section 1. The code enforcement officer is hereby authorized and directed to place a placard on the structure located at 613 Buttonwood Drive, Parcel ID: 9875417807 Town of Hillsborough, Orange County North Carolina, containing the legend:

"This building is unfit for human habitation. The use or occupation of this building for human habitation is prohibited and unlawful."

Section 2. The code enforcement officer is hereby authorized and directed to proceed to remove or demolish the above-described structure in accordance with his order to the owner and parties in interest thereof dated March 31, 2026, and in accordance with the Minimum Housing Ordinance.

Section 3. The cost of removal or demolition shall constitute a lien against the real property 613 Buttonwood Drive. The lien shall be filed in all appropriate offices of The Town of Hillsborough, including the Orange County Clerk of Superior Court's Office, and shall have the same priority and be collected in the same manner as the lien for special assessments in Article 10 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes.

Section 4. Upon completion of the required removal or demolition, the code enforcement officer shall determine whether any of the materials have resale value and shall make a reasonable effort to sell the same if so. If any materials are sold, the code enforcement officer shall credit the process

against the cost of removal or demolition, and this shall be noted as such in the recorded lien. If a surplus remains after sale of the materials and satisfaction of the cost of removal or demolition, the code enforcement officer shall deposit the surplus in the Superior Court, where it shall be secured and disbursed in the manner provided by Article 12 of Chapter 160D of the General Statutes.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove or cause to be removed the placard referenced herein and affixed to the structure. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to occupy or to permit the occupancy of any structure building therein declared to be unfit for human habitation.

Section 6. This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption.

Note: This ordinance must be recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds in the county where the property is located and must be indexed in the name of the property owner in the grantor.
