

Street Light Initiative Summary Report

Recap

- A complete LED conversion was finalized in 2024.
- Spring Valley Police identified dark spots within the city (Page 2 Map).
- City staff conducted additional evaluations to confirm repairs post-storms (Page 3 Map).
- Resident Outreach:
 - October 2024 messages were sent to Glourie Drive 1100 – 1200 block residents asking for interest in dedicating an easement for a streetlight. No responses were received from Glourie Drive residents.
 - The same message was posted on the City website in November 2024, but again no responses were received.
 - Additional outreach by Council Member Cooper yielded no responses.
- Two residents on Pine Creek Lane have since expressed interest in streetlights.

Next Steps

- Streets Without Streetlights: Research existing utility easements on these streets for new poles or adding lamps to existing poles.
 - Bridle Spur Lane
 - Guinea Drive
 - Pine Creek Lane
- Alternative Lighting Options:
 - For residents interested in increased lighting but unwilling to dedicate easements, suggest streetlamp-style lighting installed in their yards and connected to their own electricity.
 - Consider city incentives to encourage this “private lighting” option.
- Broader Resident Outreach: Utilize Constant Contact to identify residents interested in street lighting improvements at their property.
- Continued Coordination with CenterPoint: Working with a new CenterPoint representative to outline detailed next steps and potential costs for streetlight installation.
