Background

Don Zeman and Administrator Leaha Jackson met with Pam Zabrok of the Hinckley Hockey Association, Cassidy Van Vleet, Kevin McFerran, and Stuart Berberich, ice-making volunteers, about the equipment and access to the building.

With the dissolution of the Hinckley Hockey Association (HHA), its assets must be distributed to another tax-exempt organization or a governmental agency. Due to the lack of members and board members, they are not looking to reregister and maintain their nonprofit status; therefore, they opted to transfer all assets to the City of Hinckley, with a designation for the continued operation of the ice rink. The funds have been added to a 205 restricted account.
