



Are you up to date on Minnesota tax credits and tax relief programs that could result in a refund to you even if you aren't required to pay state income taxes?

K-12 Education Subtraction & K-12 Education Credit

1

Minnesota has two tax relief programs for families with children in kindergarten through 12th grade: the K-12 Education Subtraction, and the K-12 Education Credit. Both programs help lower taxes and may provide a larger refund.

Homestead Credit Refund (for Homeowners) & Renter's Property Tax Refund

2

Minnesota has two property tax relief programs for homeowners and renters: the Homestead Credit Refund (for Homeowners) and the Renter's Property Tax Refund. Both programs can provide relief to property taxes paid.

The Minnesota Child Tax Credit

3

The Minnesota Child Tax Credit (CTC) is a refundable credit equal to \$1,750 per child under 18, with no limit on the number of children. The credit phases out for those whose income is over \$29,500 (\$35,000 for Married Filing Jointly).

The Minnesota Working Family Credit

4

The Minnesota Working Family Credit (WFC) is a refundable credit for working individuals whose income is below a certain level.

The Credit for Qualifying Older Children

5

The Credit for Qualifying Older Children is a refundable credit. If you have a qualifying child who is older than 17, you may be eligible for the Credit for Qualifying Older Children.
