**Topic:** Bid Award – Crushed Limestone

### **PURPOSE**

Award the bid to purchase crushed limestone for the 2024-2025 season.

#### **PROCESS**

Public Works uses crushed limestone as part of nearly every single "dig" or trench-type backfill process. Limestone is used to partially backfill water break digs, and trenches as it creates a more firm and stable base. Once limestone is placed in a trench, the space is then backfilled with dirt. Crushed limestone is often used for underground pipe bedding — water mains, sewer mains, etc. It's one of the top materials for this task because it levels, supports, and protects the integrity of the pipeline. It's also a great insulator and will not expand or contract due to environmental factors. On April 4, 2024 annual bids were opened for the purchase and delivery of crushed limestone for the 2024-25 fiscal year. The following is a tabulation of bids received:

### **OUTCOME**

Shepley Motor Express of Thornton, IL is the lowest responsible bidder. The bid totals are based on estimated quantities used for bidding purposes only. The Department does not anticipate exceeding the approved budgeted amounts.

- Budgeted Amount: \$49,500 (General Fund \$7,000 Water/Sewer Fund \$42,500)
