Mayor, the City of Hopkinsville is the recipient of a \$50,000 T-Mobile Community Grant. The city received the check from T-Mobile yesterday (10-12-2021.) With your approval, I am recommending we award \$25,000 for painting and repairs to the Woody Winfree Fire-Transportation Museum and \$25,000 for technological upgrades to the Boys and Girls Club.

WOODY WINFREE FIRE-TRANSPORTATION MUSEUM

The **Town Clock** on the Woody Winfree Fire-Transportation Museum is the most iconic architectural element in all of Christian County, and **it needs attention.** The Museum has taken on the responsibility of its maintenance and upkeep, but our resources do not always afford us the ability to give it the care that it deserves.


On average, the Town Clock requires painting every four years. It was last painted in the summer of 2017 in preparation for the eclipse. Painting the clock includes the rental of a 75-foot, articulated lift, the purchase of oil-based paint, and the labor of one painter.


We estimate that the painting project will cost \$20,000.

In addition, window repair is still needed at the Pennyroyal Area Museum. This repair also requires the use of a lift and can be done in coordination with the Town Clock painting.

We estimate that window repair will cost an additional \$5,000.

We hope that you will consider supporting the museum as we work to make downtown Hopkinsville a more vibrant place.

Upgrade our camera system – We need cameras in the new cafeteria and other areas throughout the main building.

Cafeteria Window/Door Clings – The clings deter unwanted on-lookers while still allowing staff and youth to see who is approaching.

Defibrillator - A defibrillator will help in a medical emergency and increase sudden cardiac arrest survival rates.

I have attached a cost breakdown for the items discussed above. I greatly appreciate this opportunity.
