PROCLAMATION

National Police Week May 11-17, 2026

To recognize National Police Week 2026 and to honor those currently serving, those retired from service, and the service and sacrifice of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty while protecting our communities and safeguarding our democracy.

Whereas, there are approximately 900,000 law enforcement officers serving in communities across the United States, including the 38 sworn and 9 non-sworn members of the Hermiston Police Department;

Whereas, on average, 55,000 assaults against law enforcement officers are reported each year resulting in approximately 15,000 injuries;

Whereas, since the first recorded death in 1786, just over 25,000 law enforcement officers in the United States have made the ultimate sacrifice and have been killed in the line of duty, including 1 member of the Hermiston Police Department, Ronald G. Kilby – end of watch Thursday, October 8th, 1959;

Whereas, the names of these dedicated public servants are engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C.; and the new Ronald G. Kilby Training Room at the Hermiston Police Department has been dedicated to memorialize the importance of quality training to keep up with societal changes;

Whereas, 111 new names of fallen heroes from 2025 will be added to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, the City of Hermiston formally designates May 11th-17th, 2026, as National Police Week, and publicly salutes the service of law enforcement officers in our community and all communities across the nation.
