



# Public Safety Committee

## Meeting Minutes

April 27, 2026

---

Mayor Primmer called the meeting to order at 5:30pm. Councilor Duron was present and Councilor Barron was excused. Staff in attendance included: City Manager Byron Smith, Chief Jason Edmiston, Operations Captain Scott Clark, Administrative Captain Robert Guerrero, Investigative Lieutenant Freddy Sotelo, Patrol Lieutenant Chris Martin, Communications Manager Amanda Hartsteen, and City Recorder Lilly Alarcon-Strong.

### **Introductions & HPD Personnel Update**

Hermiston's Police Department (HPD) Chief Jason Edmiston introduced members of HPD who were in the audience and gave construction updates stating construction has completed and furniture is being installed with an expected move in date on May 1st.

### **Police Accreditation Update**

Scott Clark stated accreditation is 95% complete. The deadline to complete accreditation is July 2026, with items such as building inspection on the task list, items such as these were unable to be completed as the renovated building needs to be inspected for compliance. Once this has been completed the certification of accreditation should be accomplished within a couple of weeks.

### **1st Quarter (2026) Activity Report**

Chief Edmiston reviewed the 1st Quarter Activity Report (attached). Information was provided to include: Total crime is down 11% from last year and down 17% from the previous 10-year average, this includes 31% year-to-year reduction in violent crime and 9% deduction in property crime. There was a loss of life this year, however homicide shows zero as this was classified as manslaughter. In Oregon, an attempted murder counts as a Murder, however a manslaughter resulting in death does not.

Case investigations are up 12%, as well as officer-initiated activity at 52% from last year and a 129% increase over the 10-year average. Traffic stops are down 14% from last year. Chief Edmiston stated he believes this decrease is directly related to the hospital contract work now at 100% as officers are in more frequent contact with citizens and doing building checks but not necessarily traffic stops. Total arrests are up 14% from last year with a 29% increase over the 10-year average.

Chief Edmiston clarified that this is not a political statement, however, as Oregon continues to decriminalize more crimes that were once felonies, it is very interesting to see felony arrests have increased 54% from last year with a 24% increase over the last 10-year period. Chief Edmiston stated he will continue to track this category in the coming months but believes this increase may be felony warrants for failing to appear, probation violations, and the like.

### **Hospital Contract Update**

Chief Edmiston presented information (attached) regarding the activity logged by HPD for contract services performed at Good Shepherd Health Care System (hospital) from July 2025 through March 2026. Lieutenant Chris Martin continues to be the lead in maintaining communication with hospital staff which has proven to be successful.

The following captures the hours and activity by Hermiston Police Officers (HPD) during the time working the Good Shepherd Health Care System (GSHCS) contract.
