

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the State of Oregon, acting by and through its Oregon Parks and Recreation Department, hereinafter referred to as "OPRD" or the "State" and City of Hermiston, hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee"

Project Title:	Teen Adventure Park	
Project Type (purpose):	Development	
Project Description:	This project will create a youth adventure park targeting 12-18. The project will construct wakways, skatepark and pump track, landscaping, imigation, and rehabilitation of a precase restroom.	
Grant Funds / Maximum Reimbursement:	\$275,183.00	(50.00%)
Grantee Match Participation:	\$275,183.01	(50.00%)
Total Project Cost:	\$550,366.01	

Grant Payments / Reimbursements: Grant funds are awarded by the State and paid on a reimbursement basis, and only for the Project described in this Agreement, and the "Project Scope and Budget" included as Attachment B. The source of the Grant funds is the United States Department of the Interior, National Park Service, as specified in the Land and Water Conservation Fund Project Agreement. To request reimbursement, Grantee shall use OPRD's online grant management system accessible at oprogrants.org. The request for reimbursement shall include documentation of all project expenses plus documentation confirming project involces have been paid by Grantee. Grantee may request reimbursement as offen as quarterly for costs accrued to date


