Minutes

County Commissioner Candidate Susan Bower (via Zoom)

Ms. Bower stated that the Latino community is important and she has learned much from Jose. She encouraged everyone to vote on Nov 8th, stating there are many important items on the ballot. Some of her priorities if elected are:

- Spanish translations of county communications (i.e. agendas, minutes, notices)
- Establish a Hispanic Advisory Committee at the county level
- Ensuring diverse committees by bringing awareness of the opportunities to serve
- Stronger Spanish language presence at the county for serving citizens
- Prioritizing the proposed Cultural Center
- Expanding the existing program for high school students to tour county facilities for career exploration
- Adding a Youth Advisor Council at the county

Ms. Bower encouraged attendees to view her website where Spanish translations are available. She would like to attend HAC meetings on a regular basis. She plans to support the Spanish business community and would like to bring back a county program she helped administer with former Commissioner Elfering. Information regarding a Zoom call she is hosting on Friday is available on her website.
