**WHEREAS**, Public Safety Telecommunicators are the first and most critical contact our citizens have with emergency services;

**WHEREAS**, when an emergency occurs the prompt response of police officers, firefighters, and emergency medical personnel is critical to the protection of life and preservation of property; and

**WHEREAS**, Public Safety Telecommunicators work for the most part ‘behind the scenes’, where they support the work of the first responders, fire, police and emergency medical personnel.

**WHEREAS**, the safety of our police officers and firefighters is dependent upon the quality and accuracy of information obtained from citizens who telephone the Hutchins Communications Center; and

**WHEREAS**, Public Safety Telecommunicators are the single vital link for our police officers, firefighters, and emergency medical personnel by monitoring their activities by radio, providing them information and ensuring their safety; and

**WHEREAS**, Each Public Safety Telecommunicator has exhibited compassion, understanding and professionalism during the performance of their job in the past year.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS PROCLAIMED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hutchins, Texas, **the week of April 11th through 17th, 2024, to be National Public-Safety Telecommunications Week** in Hutchins, in honor of the men and women whose diligence and professionalism keep our city and citizens safe.
