**WHEREAS**, an effort is being made by the board members of Only Hope WNC, Inc. by hosting its 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Sleep Out on November 4 - November 5 at the Historic Courthouse on Main Street in Downtown Hendersonville in an effort to draw attention and support for youth homelessness in Henderson County.
