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AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF HOWEY-IN-THE-HILLS, 3 FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO FIREWORKS; CREATING 4 CHAPTER 93 OF THE TOWN'S CODE OF ORDINANCES, 5 ENTITLED "FIREWORKS"; DECLARING FINDINGS OF THE 6 TOWN COUNCIL; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS; SPECIFYING 7 UNLAWFUL ACTS AND MEANS OF ENFORCEMENT; 8 SPECIFYING THE CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS 9 UNDER WHICH THE TOWN MAY GRANT A PERMIT FOR A 10 PUBLIC DISPLAY OF FIREWORKS; PROVIDING FOR 11 SEVERABILITY. CONFLICTS **AMONG** ORDINANCES. 12 CODIFICATION, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 13

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- 15 Be It Ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Howey-in-the-Hills,
- 16 Florida:
- 17 **Section 1.** The title of Chapter 93 of the Code of Ordinances for the Town of
- 18 Howey-in-the-Hills, Florida, is revised to read "Fireworks." Reference to Article I
- of Chapter 93 is deleted.
- Section 2. Sections 93-1, 93-2, and 93-3 of the town code are created to read:
- 21 **Sec. 93-1.** General.
- A. **Town Council findings.** The Town Council finds that the Town of Howey-22 in-the-Hills is predominately a residential town, with few nonresidential 23 properties. The detonation and explosion of fireworks within the Town's 24 boundaries, whether by untrained individuals or by persons trained in the 25 Code of Fireworks Display approved by the American National Standards 26 Institute, can impose material risks to public safety and property. For that 27 28 reason the detonation of fireworks is subject to the prohibitions and 29 restrictions of this chapter.

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B. **Definitions.** In this chapter "fireworks" and other terms have the meanings ascribed to them in Chapter 791 of Florida Statutes. "Pyrotechnics" means

1	"fireworks." The phrase "public display of managed pyrotechnics" has the				
2	same meaning as the phrase in Chapter 791 "public display of fireworks".

14	B. Violation of subsection A and other provisions of this chapter will be subject				
15	to prosecution of a first-degree misdemeanor as provided in section 791.06				
16	of Florida Statutes or enforced through town code-enforcement proceedings				
17	under Chapters 162 and 166, Florida Statutes.				
18	Sec. 93-3. Public displays of managed pyrotechnics. A permit for the privilege				
19	of conducting within the boundaries of the town a supervised public display of				
20	managed pyrotechnics may be granted, but only under the following conditions:				
21	A. By written resolution or by motion and vote the Town Council has				
22	authorized conducting public displays of managed pyrotechnics and has not				
23	rescinded its authorization; and				
24					
25	B. The public display will occur only on one of the three dates, and only during				
26	the times, specified in section 93-2. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a public				
27	display of managed pyrotechnics may be conducted on a different date or at				
28	a different time upon its approval either by written resolution or by express				
29	motion and vote by the Town Council; and				
30					
31	C. As contemplated under section 791.012 of Florida Statutes, the public				
32	display of managed pyrotechnics will be governed by and conducted in full				
33	and strict compliance with the requirements of the National Fire Protection				

Association (NFPA) 1123, Code for Fireworks Display, 1995 Edition, 1 2 approved by the American National Standards Institute; and 3 4 D. As contemplated under section 791.02 of Florida Statutes, both the town's police chief and the county fire chief determine that the operator is 5 competent to conduct the managed pyrotechnics display; and 6 7 E. As contemplated under section 791.02 of Florida Statutes, the county fire 8 9 chief determines that the managed pyrotechnics display is of such a nature 10 and will be so located, discharged, and fired as, in the fire chief's opinion after proper inspection, will not be hazardous to property and will not 11 endanger persons; and 12 13 F. The operator of the public display of managed pyrotechnics complies with 14 all conditions, requirements, and safety precautions imposed by both the 15 police chief and the county fire chief; and 16 17 18 G. The operator of the public display of managed pyrotechnics pays to the town, before the display occurs, all costs incurred or estimated to be incurred 19 by the town and the county in connection with the public display; and 20 21 22 H. The town clerk issues the permit for the public display, but only after 23 confirmation from the police chief and the fire chief that the requirements of C, D, E, and F have been fulfilled and the operator of the public display has 24 paid in full all actual and expected costs as required under G. 25 **Section 3. Severability.** If any part of this ordinance is declared by a court of 26 competent jurisdiction to be void, unconstitutional, or unenforceable, the 27 remaining parts of the ordinance shall remain in full effect. To that end, this 28 29 ordinance is declared severable. **Section 4. Conflicts.** In a conflict between this ordinance and other existing 30 31 ordinances, this ordinance shall control and supersede. **Section 5. Codification.** The provisions of sections 1 and 2 of this ordinance are 32

to be codified in Chapter 93 of the Code of Ordinances for the Town of Howey-in-

the-Hills, Florida. No other sections are to be codified.

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Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon its enactment.
