Re: Consideration and Approval: Piggyback Agreement - Aquatic Vegetation Control

Objective:

To piggyback off the City of Leesburg agreement to secure a contractor to provide aquatic vegetation management services to the Town for over 4,000+ feet of shoreline along Little Lake Harris/Griffin Stormwater Park. The Town Attorney has reviewed the agreement and has stated that is it appropriate to piggyback.

Summary:

Procuring a contractor to provide aquatic vegetation management services for the Little Lake Harris nature shoreline would reduce the growth of invasive aquatic plants. This is crucial for maintaining a healthy and balanced ecosystem. This would allow native plants to thrive to create better water quality, healthier fish and wildlife habitats, and help stabilize the shoreline to prevent soil erosion. Which would also create a more beautiful shoreline for all residents and visitors to enjoy.
