## We Promote Literacy and a Love of Reading!

Literacy rates and educational levels are closely connected with the ability to participate in the workforce and engage as citizens.

How does IPL promote literacy and reading?
Programs provide exposure, motivation, and a love of reading:

- Summer Reading Program
- Story Times
- 1000 Books Before Kindergarten
- Early Literacy Stations

### **Building Maintenance**

The library has had two compressors in our largest geothermal units/zones go out this summer. They have been replaced, and the building is cooling much better now. The steel shingles will be installed on the roof in September. We are thankful for the maintenance of the facility.

### **Tree Sculpture**

Funds from several groups are being combined to allow the trunk of the oak tree that was removed last summer from the park north of the library to be turned into a sculpture.
