Section 1. **Section 1.** The Board of Aldermen of the City of Jackson, Missouri, finds it necessary and hereby declares its intent to borrow \$10,100,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, extending, and improving the combined waterworks and sewerage system of the City (the "Project") and to evidence such borrowing by the issuance of combined waterworks and sewerage system revenue bonds of the City (the "Bonds") in the amount of \$10,100,000.00.

**Section 2.** A special bond election is hereby ordered to be held in the City of Jackson, Missouri, on Tuesday, August 2, 2022, on the following question:

### QUESTION

Shall the City of Jackson, Missouri, issue its combined waterworks and sewerage system revenue bonds in the amount of \$10,100,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, extending, and improving the combined waterworks and sewerage system of the City; the cost of operation and maintenance of said system and the principal of and interest on said revenue bonds to be payable solely from the revenues derived by the City from the operation of its combined waterworks and sewerage system, including all future extensions and improvements thereto?

The authorization of the Bonds will authorize the City to fix, establish, maintain, and collect rates and charges for the services provided by the City through its combined waterworks and sewerage system, including all extension and improvements thereto hereafter constructed or acquired by the City, in addition to the other rates and charges for such services provided by law as will produce income and revenues sufficient to provide funds to pay the costs of operation and maintenance of the combined waterworks and sewerage system and the principal of and interest on the Bonds as they become due and to retire the same within thirty-five years from the date thereof and to provide for the establishment of reasonable reserves therefor.

- **Section 3.** The form of the Notice of Bond Election for said special election, a copy of which is hereby attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby approved.
- **Section 4.** The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to notify the County Clerk of Cape Girardeau County, Missouri, of the adoption of this ordinance no later than 5:00 p.m. on May 24, 2022, and to include in said notification all of the terms and provisions required by Chapter 115 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri, as amended.
- **Section 5.** The City expects to make expenditures on and after the date of the adoption of this ordinance in connection with the Project and the City intends to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds. The maximum principal amount of the Bonds expected to be issued for the Project is \$10,100,000.00.
- **Section 6.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
