



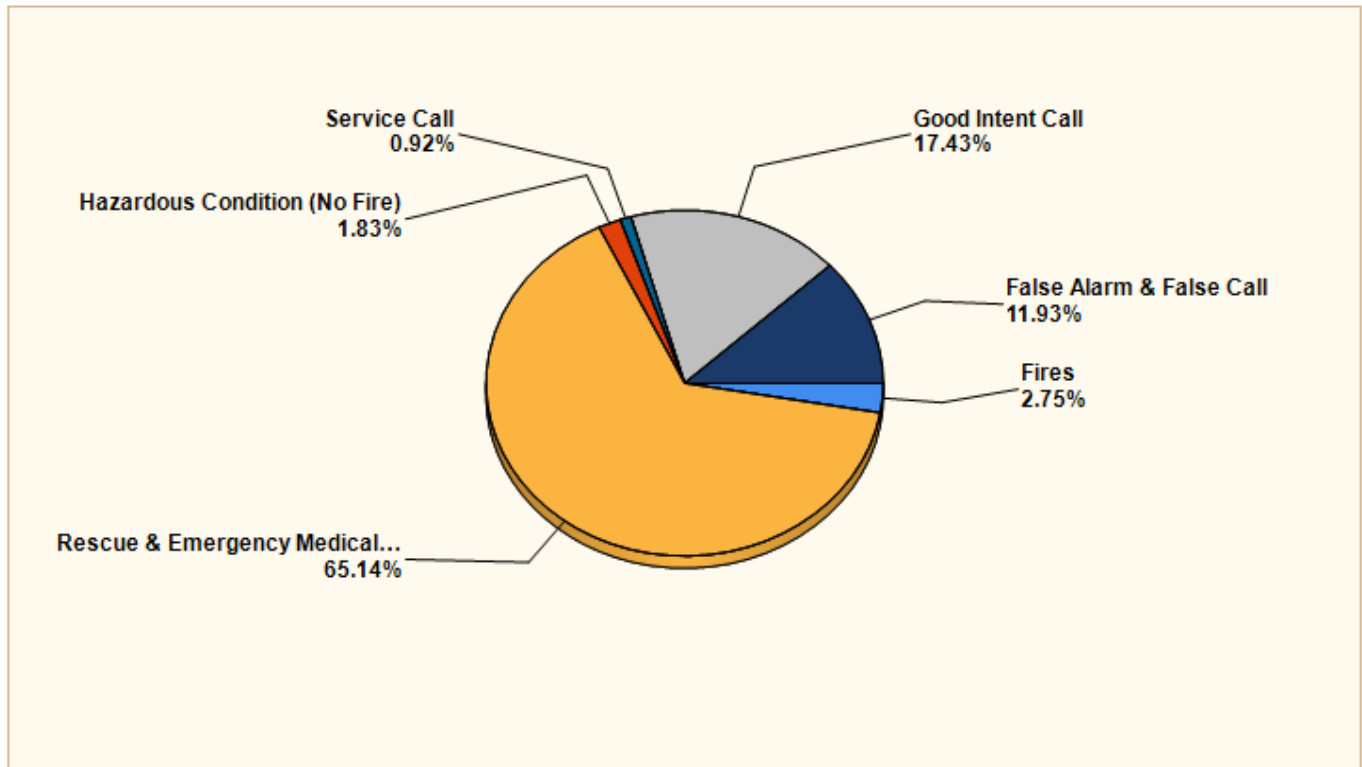

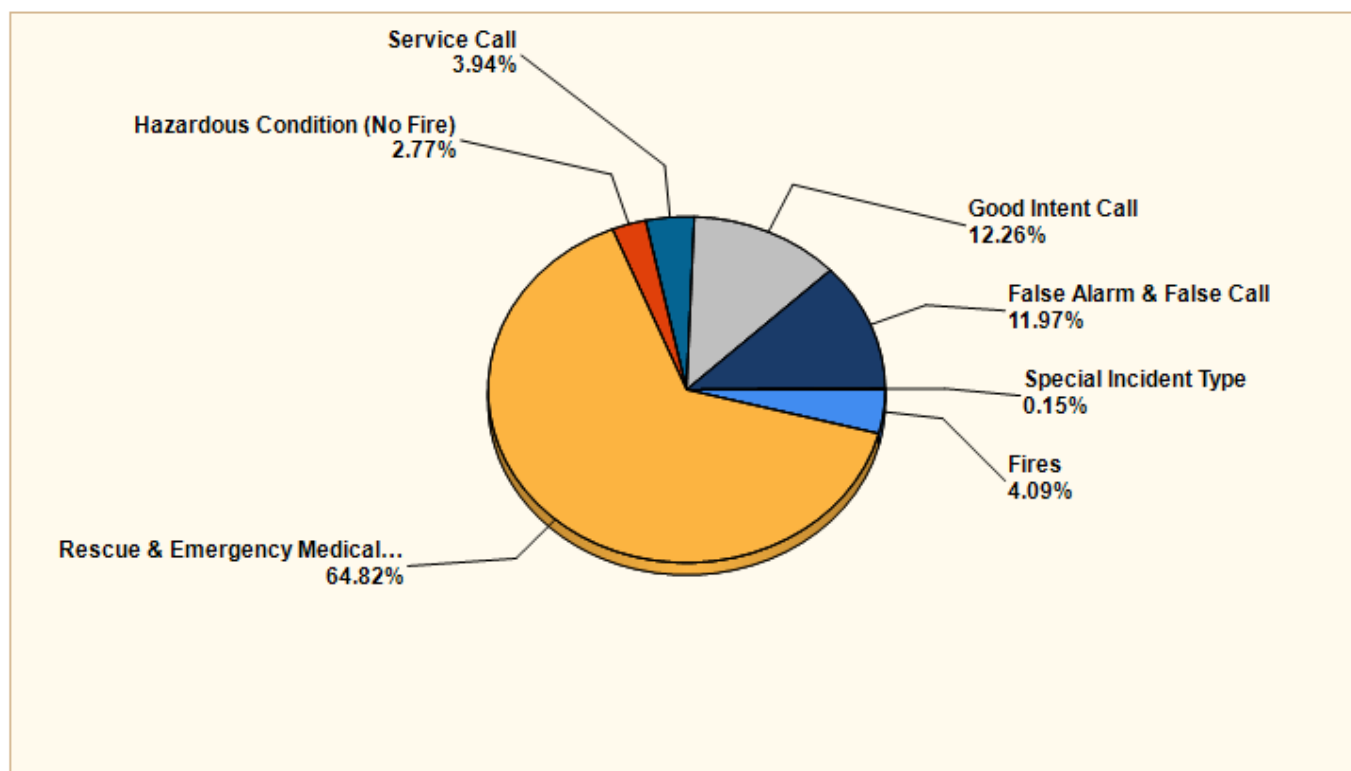

Other Items of Interest:

Lieutenant Bradley Spooone, Lieutenant Lee Rayburn, Senior Firefighter Aaron Lee, and Firefighters Caleb Tobaris, Colton Malone attended the annual Smokey Mountain Training Weekend in Sevier County in June.

Chief Lee Turner, Lieutenant Lee Rayburn, and Firefighter II Robert Shular attended the IAFC's Hazardous Materials Team Conference in Baltimore, Maryland in June.

The Department hosted its annual Kid's Fire Camp in June. The camp was attended by 45 students, ages 7-13 years old. Attendees learned about fire safety, prevention, fire department operations, CPR and first aid.

The JCFD also held its first Fire Cadet Academy in June. This new program focused on 13-17 year old students as a next step after Kid's Fire Camp. Attendees were instructed in fire suppression operations, firefighter personal protective gear, ladders, rappelling, CPR/first aid and swift water operations. 11 students attended.

The Department hosted the TFACA's 32-hour Rapid Intervention Team (RIT) Operations course in June. 10 Jefferson City Firefighters attended the very difficult course which focused on rescuing firefighters who have become injured or unable to escape a structure fire.
