

Minutes of Beer Board Meeting
July 6, 2026

The City Council of Jefferson City met in special called Beer Board meeting on Monday, July 6, 2026, at 5:00 p.m., prior to the regular City Council meeting at City Hall, 112 City Center Drive, with Chairman Mitch Cain presiding.

Roll call by the City Recorder was as follows:

Also present were James Gallup, City Manager; Robert Burts, City Attorney, and Bettina Chandler, City Recorder.

A Public Hearing was held for an application for a Certificate of Compliance for an off-premises liquor store for The Barrell House Liquor & Wine located at 110 West Broadway Blvd. There were no citizen comments.

Keyur Patel of The Barrell House Liquor & Wine spoke on behalf of the application.

Vice Chairman Bunch made a motion, seconded by Chairman Cain, to approve an off-premises liquor store for The Barrell House Liquor & Wine located at 110 West Broadway Blvd. Board Member Melton stated he would like to see a cap placed on the number of liquor stores permitted within Jefferson City. Vice Chairman Bunch requested a roll call. The vote was as follows:

The motion failed on a 3-2 vote.

Mr. Patel asked if he could address the Board, and Chairman Cain granted his request. Mr. Patel stated that he is not opening a new liquor store but is purchasing and taking over an existing store already operating at the location. Chairman Cain acknowledged Mr. Patel's statement but advised that the Board had already rendered its decision.

Chairman Cain then asked whether the application could be reconsidered at a future meeting. Mrs. Chandler, City Recorder, responded that it could be considered again; however, she would need to review the City's code to determine whether a waiting period applies. She also advised that Mr. Patel

would be required to submit a new application and pay the \$250 application fee, as it is a non-refundable fee.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:06 p.m.
