22	WHEREAS, in accordance with Article VII, Section 3 of the Town Charter, the							
23	Town's Charter Review Committee ("Committee") reviewed the provisions of the Charter							
24	and recommended certain amendments; and							
25								
26	WHEREAS, the Committee recommended revising Article III, Section 6 of the							
27	Charter to allow for removal of the Mayor and Councilmembers if they are convicted of or							
28	plead nolo contendere to certain crimes, and the Town Council wishes to incorporate							
29 20	such requirements in the candidate qualifying section, clarify the requirements for							
30 31	residency, and provide for the removal of the Mayor or a Councilmember for failure to maintain the candidacy requirements; and							
31 32	maintain the candidacy requirements, and							
32 33	WHEREAS, the Town Council determines that it is in the best interests of the							
34	residents of the Town of Juno Beach to submit the proposed Town Charter amendment							
35	to referendum vote.

37	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE							
38	TOWN OF JUNO BEACH, FLORIDA as follows:

40	Section 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby ratified as true and							
41	correct and are incorporated herein.							
42 43	Section 2 The Town Council bareby amondo Article III. "Logislative" Section 1							
43 44	Section 2. The Town Council hereby amends Article III, "Legislative," Section 1, "Form of government; town council; power and composition; qualification; residency," and							
44 45	Section 6, "Vacancies; forfeiture of office; filling of vacancies," of the Town Charter to read

6	Sec. 1. Form of government; town council; power and composition;

9	(b) Only electors of the town who have been continuous residents for at							
10	least one (1) year immediately preceding the date of filing of their							
11	notice of candidacy shall be eligible to hold the office of mayor or							
12	councilmember. All candidates for mayor or councilmember shall							
13	submit an affidavit prior to qualification for office demonstrating that							
14	they meet the residency requirement. As used in this section and for							
15	the purpose of completing the affidavit, "residency" shall require: (1)							
16	a place of abode within the town where the prospective candidate							
17	actually lives; and (2) the present intent of making that place of abode							
18	the person's permanent home. Additionally, the affidavit shall state							
19	that the candidate is registered to vote at the candidate's place of							
20	abode at the time of qualification. No elector shall qualify for the office							
21 22	of mayor or councilmember if he or she has been convicted or pled							
22 23	nolo contendere to any felony or has been convicted or pled nolo							
23 24	<u>contendere to any crime of fraud or dishonesty including, by way of</u> example, larceny, theft, burglary, forgery, perjury, or embezzlement.

28	Sec. 6. Vacancies; forfeiture of office; filling of vacancies.							
29								
30	(a) Vacancies. The office of mayor or of a councilmember shall become							
31	vacant upon death, resignation, or removal from office in any manner							
32	authorized by law of such mayor or councilmember or if such mayor							
33	or councilmember ceases to be an elector of the town or ceases to							
34	meet the requirements for candidacy set forth in section 1(b) of this							
35	article as determined by the remaining members of the council.							
36								
37	Section 3. The amendment to the Town Charter set forth in Section 2 above							
38	shall not take effect unless and until it is submitted to the electors of the Town of Juno							
39 40	Beach. The amendment shall be submitted at the Town's general election to be held on							
40	Tuesday, March 19, 2024.							
41 42	Section 4. The title of the ballot and evaluations statement setting forth the							
42 43	Section 4. The title of the ballot and explanatory statement setting forth the							
43 44	substance of the amendment to the Town Charter shall appear on the ballot and shall read as follows:

18	Section 5. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to advertise the						
19	referendum election contemplated herein in accordance with Section 100.342, Florida						
20	Statutes, and Section 8-6 of the Town Code of Ordinances.						
21							
22	Section 6. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made part of						
23	the Charter of the Town of Juno Beach, Florida.						
24							
25	Section 7. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this						
26	Ordinance is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be						
27	unconstitutional, inoperative, or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of the						
28	Ordinance.						
29							
30	Section 8. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Town of Juno Beach,						
31	Florida, which are in conflict with this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of						
32	such conflict.						
33							
34	Section 9. This Ordinance shall become effective upon approval of a majority						
35	of the electors casting their votes at the March 19, 2024 election. If not approved by a						
36	majority of the voters voting in the election, this Ordinance shall be automatically						
37	repealed.
